A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF HONORING AND  
2 RECOGNIZING A CENTURY OF GOVERNMENT AND CIVIC LEADERSHIP  
3 BY NORTH CAROLINA WOMEN.

5 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

6 Section 1.(a) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of  
7 Secretary of State the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1999-2000  
8 fiscal year to update and reprint the directory of women in the North Carolina General  
9 Assembly, in partnership with the Western Carolina Women's Coalition and the North  
10 Carolina Council for Women.

11 Section 1.(b) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of  
12 Administration the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1999-2000  
13 fiscal year for the North Carolina Council for Women to fund "A Century of  
14 Women" statewide celebrations and to strengthen resources and support of women's  
15 organizations and coalitions.

16 Section 1.(c) There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Western  
17 Carolina Women's Coalition, Inc., a nonprofit corporation, the sum of twenty-five  
18 thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year to support expansion of the

1 regional network in the 25 westernmost counties among women and women's  
2 organizations aimed at fostering communication and collaboration and building capacity  
3 for economic self-sufficiency, leadership, and service and to support a major Women's  
4 Conference and Women's Equality Day event which the coalition has sponsored since  
5 1989.

6           Section 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
