March 22, 1999 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO PROHIBIT TELEPHONE SOLICITORS MAKING TELEPHONE SOLICITATIONS TO RESIDENTIAL TELEPHONE SUBSCRIBERS FROM BLOCKING A SUBSCRIBER'S USE OF A CALLER IDENTIFICATION SERVICE. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: Section 1. Chapter 75 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new section to read: "§ 75-30.1. Telephone solicitations; circumventing caller identification service prohibited. No telephone solicitor who makes a telephone solicitation to the telephone line of a residential telephone subscriber in this State shall knowingly use any method to block or otherwise circumvent that subscriber's use of a caller identification service. No provider of a caller identification service shall be liable for violations of this subsection committed by other persons. For purposes of this section: (b) 'Caller identification service' means a type of telephone service that permits telephone subscribers to see the telephone number of incoming

telephone calls.
