1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A PILOT PROJECT TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO HEALTH
3	CARE COVERAGE IN NORTH CAROLINA.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	Section 1. The purpose of this act is to authorize and encourage tailoring of
6	health care delivery and benefits to meet a particular community's needs, while
7	maintaining safeguards, so as to increase the affordability, efficiency, and fairness of
8	health care coverage for small employers. The goal of the Pilot Project established in this
9	act is to allow for a limited time and in a controlled manner, the relaxation of some
10	mandates in order to inject flexibility and advantages to small employers and their
11	employees, while maintaining supervision by appropriate State agencies.
12	Section 2. The Buncombe County Area Small Business Health Care
13	Purchasing Alliance Pilot Project is hereby established as follows:
14	(1) The State Health Plan Purchasing Alliance Board shall establish the
15	Buncombe County Area Small Business Health Care Purchasing
16	Alliance (the "Alliance") pursuant to G.S. 143-627 that shall possess the
17	powers and duties of the Alliance as set forth in G.S. 143-628.

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- The Buncombe County Medical Society shall serve as the Community (2)1 2 Sponsor for the Buncombe County Area Small Business Health Care 3 Purchasing Alliance and shall submit a proposed plan of operation of 4 the Alliance to the State Health Plan Purchasing Alliance Board. 5 The Alliance shall design an initial basic benefit plan tailored to the (3) 6 designated Buncombe County market area needs. It is anticipated that 7 the plan will be a guaranteed issue plan. There shall be no individual medical underwriting and no separate "high-risk"policies. The premium 8 9 shall be actuarially sound but not necessarily be adjusted community 10 rated. The Alliance may develop one or more additional plans, including a premier benefit plan option. All plans shall be submitted to 11 12 the Department of Insurance and the State Health Plan Purchasing Alliance Board. 13 14 (4) The Alliance shall coordinate enrollment of suitable member small 15 employers into the Alliance and notify them of the availability of 16 coverage. Only small employers who at the time of enrollment and 17 during the previous six months did not maintain a health insurance plan 18 for its employees shall be considered a suitable member small employer. The Alliance may solicit competitive bids from Accountable Health 19 (5) 20 Carriers to offer the plan or plans developed by the Alliance to 21 employees of member small employers. The Alliance may impose a reasonable administrative surcharge or fee 22 (6) on member small employers for Pilot Project administration. 23 24 The Pilot Project shall at all times remain subject to the jurisdiction in (7) regulation of the North Carolina Department of Insurance and the State 25 Health Plan Purchasing Alliance Board. 26 27 (8) The Alliance shall have the flexibility to develop reasonable measures to ensure enrollment stability and fiscal solvency while encouraging 28 29 efficiency. 30 Section 3. The Pilot Project is exempt from only such general or local law or rule to the contrary, including inter Palia, contrary provisions of G.S. 143-621 through 31 32 G.S. 143-636 (Health Care Purchasing Alliance Act), G.S. 58-49-30 through G.S. 58-49-33 65 (Multiple Employer Welfare Arrangements). The Pilot Project is exempt from G.S. 58-50-100 through G.S. 58-50-155 (North Carolina Small Employer Group Health 34 35 Coverage Reform Act) when the number of employee enrollees exceeds 150. 36 Section 4. The Alliance shall present a report with recommendations to the State Health Plan Purchasing Alliance Board and to the Joint Legislative Health Care 37 38 Oversight Committee on or before March 1, 2004. The North Carolina Department of 39 Insurance may provide input and findings to the Board. The Board shall report its 40 findings and recommendations to the General Assembly on or before May 1, 2004. To the extent funds are available from the State Health Plan 41 Section 5. Purchasing Alliance Fund, the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) shall be 42
- 43 allocated to the Pilot Project for the first year of its operation, and the sum of fifteen

- 1 thousand dollars (\$15,000) for the second year of its operation. Thereafter the Pilot
- 2 Project shall be self-sustaining.
- 3 Section 7. This act becomes effective September 1, 1999 and expires August
  31, 2004.
