A HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING CONGRESS TO DESIGNATE APRIL 30 AS 1 2 CHILDREN'S DAY. 3 Whereas, children are special citizens of America who deserve to be 4 recognized, nurtured, loved, and protected; and 5 Whereas, children are valued members of society who bring joy, pride, and hope to this nation and her future: and 6 Whereas, the designation of a day equal to Mother's Day and Father' Day to 7 annually acknowledge children will provide focus whereby the nation, organizations, and 8 9 individuals can simultaneously celebrate the children; and 10 Whereas, an appropriate day to designate as Children's Day is in springtime when the innocence of new life is a constant reminder to nurture, love, and protect and 11 when governing bodies who can affect children's issues are in session; Now, therefore, 12 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives: 13 Section 1. The House of Representatives urges Congress to designate April 30 14 of the present year and every year thereafter as Children's Day. 15 The House of Representatives further urges Congress on the passage of Children's Day to request that 16 the President of the United States issue a proclamation calling upon the citizens of this 17 nation to annually observe April 30 with appropriate ceremonies and activities 18 commensurate with Mother's Day and Father's Day including full calendar recognition. 19 Section 2. The Principal Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of this resolution 20

21 to each member of North Carolina's Congressional Delegation.
