The Legislative Research Commission may study the following issues relating to managed care: 5 Quality of care. 6 (1) 7 (2) Cost of care and cost-containment measures of managed care plans. Section 2. In order to facilitate deliberation on any legislation recommended to the 2000 Regular Session, the Commission may consider appointing members of the Insurance Committees of the House and Senate to the study committee that examines the issues in Section 1 of this act.

Section 3. The Commission may report its findings and recommendations to the 2000 Regular Session of the 1999 General Assembly.

Section 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
