A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ADJUST THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR MEMBERS OF THE FIREMEN'S AND RESCUE SQUAD WORKERS' PENSION FUND.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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Section 1. G.S. 58-86-25 reads as rewritten:

"§ 58-86-25. 'Eligible firemen' defined; determination and certification of volunteers meeting qualifications.

'Eligible firemen' shall mean all firemen of the State of North Carolina or any political subdivision thereof, including those performing such functions in the protection of life and property through fire fighting within a county or city governmental unit and so certified to the Commissioner of Insurance by the governing body thereof, and who belong to a bona fide fire department which, as determined by the Commissioner, is classified as not less than elass "9" or class "A" and "AA" departments a Class 9S department in accordance with rating methods, schedules, classifications, underwriting rules, bylaws or regulations effective or applied with respect to the establishment of rates or premiums used or charged pursuant to Articles 36 or 40 of this Chapter or by such other reasonable methods as the Commissioner may determine, and which operates fire apparatus and equipment of the value of five thousand dollars (\$5,000) or more, and said—and the fire

department holds drills and meetings not less than four hours monthly and said firemen 1 2 monthly. For purposes of membership in the Firemen's and Rescue Squad Workers' 3 Pension Fund, 'eligible firemen' shall attend at least 36 hours of all drills and meetings in 4 each calendar vear. "Eligible firemen" shall also mean those persons meeting the other qualifications of this section, not exceeding 25 volunteer firemen plus one additional volunteer 5 fireman per 100 population in the area served by their respective departments.—Each 6 7 department shall annually determine and report the names of those firemen, 8 indicating those meeting the eligibility qualifications of this section to its respective 9 governing body, which upon determination of the validity and accuracy of the qualification shall promptly certify the list to the board. the Department of Insurance, 10 which shall provide a list of those meeting the eligibility requirements of this section to 11 the State Treasurer by April 1 of each year. For the purposes of the preceding sentence, 12 the governing body of a fire department operated: by a county is the county board of 13 commissioners; by a city is the city council; by a sanitary district is the sanitary district 14 board; by a corporation, whether profit or nonprofit, is the corporation's board of 15 16 directors; and by any other entity is that group designated by the board."

Section 2. G.S. 58-86-30 reads as rewritten:

"§ 58-86-30. 'Eligible rescue squad worker' defined; determination and certification of eligibility.

'Eligible rescue squad worker' means a person who is a member of a rescue or emergency medical services squad that is eligible for membership in the North Carolina Association of Rescue and Emergency Medical Services, Inc., and who who, for purposes of membership in the Firemen's and Rescue Squad Workers' Pension Fund, has attended a minimum of 36 hours of training and meetings in the last calendar year. Each rescue or emergency medical services squad eligible for membership in the North Carolina Association of Rescue and Emergency Medical Services, Inc., must file a roster certified by the secretary of the association of those rescue or emergency medical services squad workers meeting the requirements of this section with the State Treasurer by January 1 April 1 of each calendar year.

'Eligible rescue squad worker' does not mean 'eligible fireman' as defined by G.S. 58-86-25, nor may an 'eligible rescue squad worker' qualify also as an 'eligible fireman' in order to receive double benefits available under this Article."

Section 3. G.S. 58-86-35 reads as rewritten:

"§ 58-86-35. Firemen's application for membership in fund; monthly payments by members; payments credited to separate accounts of members.

Those firemen who are eligible pursuant to G.S. 58-86-25 may make application for membership to the board. Each fireman upon becoming a member of the fund shall pay the director of the fund the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month. The monthly payments shall be credited to the separate account of the member and shall be kept by the custodian so it is available for payment on withdrawal from membership or retirement. Firemen who fail to meet the training hour requirements specified in G.S. 58-86-25 for any year shall lose that year's service credit."

Section 4. G.S. 58-86-40 reads as rewritten:

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"§ 58-86-40. Rescue squad worker's application for membership in funds; monthly payments by members; payments credited to separate accounts of members.

Those rescue squad workers eligible pursuant to G.S. 58-86-30 may apply to the board for membership. Each eligible rescue squad worker upon becoming a member shall pay the director of the fund the sum of ten dollars (\$10.00) per month. The monthly payments shall be credited to the separate account of the member and shall be kept by the custodian so it is available for payment on withdrawal from membership or retirement. Rescue squad workers who fail to meet the training hour requirements specified in G.S. 58-86-30 for any year shall lose that year's service credit."

Section 5. G.S. 58-86-45(a) is repealed.

Section 6. G.S. 58-86-75 reads as rewritten:

"§ 58-86-75. Determination of creditable service; information furnished by applicants for membership.

The board shall determine by appropriate rules and regulations the number of years' credit for service of firemen and rescue squad workers. Firemen and rescue squad workers who are now serving as such shall furnish the board with information upon applying for membership as to previous service. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Article, the Board may grant qualified prior service credits to eligible firemen and rescue squad workers under such terms and conditions that the Board may adopt when the Board determines that an eligible fireman or rescue squad worker has been denied such service credits through no fault of his own. Firemen and rescue squad workers who fail to meet the training hour requirements specified in G.S. 58-86-25 and G.S. 58-86-30 for any year shall lose that year's service credit."

Section 7. G.S. 143-166.2(d) reads as rewritten:

The term 'law-enforcement officer,' 'officer,' or 'fireman' shall mean all lawenforcement officers employed full time by the State of North Carolina or any county or municipality thereof and all full-time custodial employees of the North Carolina Department of Correction and all full-time institutional and detention employees of the Division of Youth Services of the Department of Health and Human Services. The term 'firemen' 'fireman' shall mean both 'eligible fireman'; or 'fireman' 'eligible firemen' as defined in G.S. 58-86-25 and all full-time, permanent part-time and temporary employees of the North Carolina Division of Forest Resources, Department of Environment and Natural Resources, during the time they are actively engaged in fire-fighting activities; and shall mean all full-time employees of the North Carolina Department of Insurance during the time they are actively engaged in fire-fighting activities, during the time they are training fire fighters or rescue squad workers, and during the time they are engaged in activities as members of the State Emergency Response Team, when the Team has been activated. However, 'eligible firemen' as defined in G.S. 58-86-25 shall be eligible for benefits under this Article regardless of whether or not they attended at least 36 hours of drills and meetings as required by G.S. 58-86-25 if (i) killed in the line of duty in the first year of service to the fire department; or (ii) killed in the line of duty within two years of the last year in which they attended 36 hours of drills and meetings. The term 'rescue squad

worker' shall mean a person who is dedicated to the purpose of alleviating human 1 2 suffering and assisting anyone who is in difficulty or who is injured or becomes suddenly 3 ill by providing the proper and efficient care or emergency medical services. In addition. 4 this person must belong to an organized rescue squad which is eligible for membership in 5 the North Carolina Association of Rescue Squads, Inc., and the person must have 6 attended a minimum of 36 hours of training and meetings in the last calendar year, 7 except that rescue squad workers shall be eligible for benefits under this Article 8 regardless of whether or not they attended at least 36 hours of drills and meetings if (i) 9 killed in the line of duty in the first year of service to the rescue squad; or (ii) killed in the 10 line of duty within two years of the last year in which they attended 36 hours of drills and meetings. Each rescue squad belonging to the North Carolina Association of Rescue 11 12 Squads, Inc., must file a roster of those members meeting the above requirements with 13 the State Treasurer on or about January 1 of each year, and this roster must be certified to 14 by the secretary of said association. In addition, the term 'rescue squad worker' shall 15 mean a member of an ambulance service certified by the Department of Health and 16 Human Services pursuant to Article 7 of Chapter 131E of the General Statutes. The 17 Department of Health and Human Services shall furnish a list of ambulance service 18 members to the State Treasurer on or about January 1 of each year. The term 'Civil Air Patrol members' shall mean those senior members of the North Carolina Wing-Civil Air 19 20 Patrol 18 years of age or older and currently certified pursuant to G.S. 143B-491(a). The 21 term 'fireman' shall also mean county fire marshals when engaged in the performance of their county duties. The term 'rescue squad worker' shall also mean county emergency 22 23 services coordinators when engaged in the performance of their county duties." 24

Section 8. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
