Section 1. Chapter 7A of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Article to read:

"ARTICLE 33.

"CONFERENCE OF CLERKS OF SUPERIOR COURT.

"§ 7A-420. Establishment and purpose.

There is created the Conference of Clerks of Superior Court of North Carolina, of which the elected Clerk of Superior Court of each county in the State of North Carolina is a member. The purpose of the Conference is to assist in improving the administration of justice in North Carolina by coordinating the case processing and judicial efforts of the various Clerks of Superior Court. The Conference shall exercise the powers and duties provided for in this Article.

- "§ 7A-421. Annual meetings; organization; election of officers.
- 16 (a) Annual Meetings. The Conference shall meet annually at a time and place 17 selected by the President of the Conference.

- The Conference may not adopt rules pursuant to Chapter 150B of the General (b) Statutes.

"§ 7A-423. Executive Secretary; clerical support.

- The Conference may employ an Executive Secretary and any necessary supporting staff to assist it in carrying out its duties."
