A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT TO SET THE SALARIES OF DISTRICT ATTORNEYS AT AN AMOUNT
2 THAT IS THE MIDPOINT BETWEEN THE SALARY OF A SENIOR REGULAR
3 RESIDENT SUPERIOR COURT JUDGE AND THE SALARY OF A CHIEF
4 DISTRICT COURT JUDGE.

6 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

7 Section 1. G.S. 7A-65(a) reads as rewritten:

8 "(a) The annual salary of district attorneys ~~and shall be the midpoint between the~~
9 salary of a senior regular resident superior court judge and the salary of a chief district
10 court judge, as provided by law. The annual salary of full-time assistant district attorneys
11 shall be as provided in the Current Operations Appropriations Act. When traveling on
12 official business, each district attorney and assistant district attorney is entitled to
13 reimbursement for his subsistence and travel expenses to the same extent as State
14 employees generally."

15 Section 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial
16 Department the sum of one hundred ninety-five thousand four hundred forty-eight dollars
17 (\$195,448) for the 1999-2000 fiscal year and the sum of one hundred ninety-five
18 thousand four hundred forty-eight dollars (\$195,448) for the 2000-2001 fiscal year to
19 increase salaries of district attorneys as provided in Section 1 of this act.

1 Section 3. This act becomes effective July 1, 1999.
