## "§ 90-157.11. Instruction and training required to perform spinal manipulation.

No health care provider shall perform a spinal manipulation or adjustment or permit, direct, or authorize any person under the provider's direct supervision to perform a spinal manipulation or adjustment unless he or she has received a minimum of 500 hours of classroom instruction in spinal manipulation or adjustment and a minimum of 700 hours of supervised clinical training at a facility where spinal manipulation or adjustment is a primary method of treatment.
