PRINCIPAL DEPARTMENT(S) &

PROGRAM(S) AFFECTED: Local boards of education and County Commissioners

EFFECTIVE DATE: Effective when it becomes law, and applies to construction after January 1, 2000.

BILL SUMMARY: Adds new GS 115C-520.1 providing that new public schools designed after cited date are subject to following maximum student capacities: kindergarten through fifth grade: 300 students; sixth through eighth grades, 500 students; ninth through 12 grades, 700 students.

ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:

- 1. Because of enrollment increases, a substantially number of new schools are expected to be built throughout the state within the next five years.
- 2. The bill will increase the number of individual school buildings constructed by local school boards.
- 3. A preliminary review of the bill by the Division of School Planning, Department of Public Instruction indicates that the immediate area of increased cost would be in site costs.

- 4. Operating costs might also be somewhat higher on a per student basis in the smaller school, but these costs are not dealt with in this fiscal note.
- 5. Below are three examples of the economy of scale differences that occur in the three different size buildings required under the bill.
