8	In addition to	the powers and duties designated in G.S. 115C-36, local boards of
9	education shall have	ave the power or duty:
10	<u>(39)</u>	<u>To Notify Parents About An Experimental Writing Curriculum. –</u>
11		To require all schools that are continuing to use the experimental
12		writing curriculum that encourages "inventive spelling" and
13		discourages explicit instruction in grammar, usage, punctuation and
14		the mechanics of writing to notify all parents prior to the beginning of
15		classes. These schools shall also furnish parents with a set of charts
16		showing the percentage of 10 <sup>th</sup> grade students proficient in the
17		mechanics of writing (spelling, sentence formation, usage of grammar)
18		over the last 10 years.
19		All parents of students who do not test as proficient on the 4th or
20		10th grade writing test shall also be furnished a copy of the charts, and
21		the charts shall be prominently posted on the Department of Public
22		Instruction website and disseminated to all news media.
23		If a parent objects to the use of the experimental "integrated
24		language arts curriculum" in instructing his or her child, the child shall
25		be instructed using a traditional approach to teach writing.
26		State writing tests shall not be released by the Department of Public
27		Instruction without giving the sub-skill errors the same prominence as
28		the "holistic" score."
