A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO RECOGNIZE THE SOVEREIGNTY OF THE EASTERN BAND OF CHEROKEE INDIANS AND TO PROVIDE FULL FAITH AND CREDIT TO JUDGMENTS AND ORDERS OF THE TRIBAL COURT.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. Chapter 1 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a new Subchapter XVI, Article 51, to read:

"Subchapter XVI. Courts of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

"<u>Article 51.</u>

"Full Faith and Credit.

"§ 1-602. Courts of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians; full faith and credit.

- (a) The State of North Carolina recognizes the inherent sovereignty of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and acknowledges that the jurisdiction of the Eastern Band, including its Judicial Branch, extends to all persons, activities, and property within the territory of the Eastern Band. The State further acknowledges that the Cherokee Court has jurisdiction over claims arising within the territory of the Eastern Band, notwithstanding any rights-of-way granted to the State and others. The North Carolina courts shall defer to the jurisdiction of the Cherokee Court in such matters.
- (b) The Eastern Band gives full faith and credit to judgments, decrees, and orders of the State courts. A judgment, decree, or order signed by a judicial officer of the Eastern Band and filed in the Cherokee Court shall be given full faith and credit by the North Carolina courts to the same extent as a judgment, decree, or order of another state."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
