2	AN ACT TO MAKE POSSESSION OR MANUFACTURE OF FRAUDULENT		
3	FORMS OF IDENTIFICATION AN OFFENSE.		
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
5	SECTION 1. Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by adding a		
6	new section to read:		
7	7 " <u>§ 14-100.1. Possession or manufacture of fraudulent forms of identification.</u>		
8	(a) If any person shall knowingly and designedly possess a false or fraudulent		
9	form of identification, that person shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.		
10	(b) If any person shall knowingly and designedly manufacture a false or		
11	fraudulent form of identification, that person shall be guilty of a Class H felony.		
12	(c) For purposes of this section a "form of identification" shall include all of the		
13	following:		
14	(1) An operator's, chauffeur's, commercial driver's, or similar type of		
15	drivers license containing a picture, issued by the Division of Motor		
16	Vehicles or an equivalent agency in any state.		
17	(2) An identification card containing a picture, issued by any department,		
18	agency, or subdivision of the State of North Carolina.		
19	(3) <u>A military identification card containing a picture.</u>		
20	(4) <u>A passport.</u>		
21	(5) An alien registration card containing a picture.		
22	(6) Any form of identification containing a picture."		
23	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective December 1, 2001, and applies to		
24	offenses committed on or after that date.
