2	AN ACT TO ALTER THE MANNER IN WHICH MEMBERS OF THE		
3	ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT COMMISSION ARE APPOINTED AND		
4	TO PROVIDE FOR STAGGERED FOUR-YEAR TERMS FOR MEMBERS OF		
5	THE COMMISSION.		
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 143B-283 reads as rewritten:		
8	"§ 143B-283. Environmental Management Commission – members; selection;		
9	removal; compensation; quorum; services.		
10	(a) The Environmental Management Commission shall consist of 13 members		
11	appointed by the Governor. The Governor shall select the members so that the		
12	membership of the Commission shall consist of:17 members appointed as follows:		
13	(1) One who shall be who, at the time of appointment, is a licensed		
14	physician with specialized training and experience in the health effects		
15	of environmental pollution; pollution; appointed by the Governor.		
16	(2) One who shall, who, at the time of appointment, be is actively		
17	connected with the Commission for Health Services or local board of		
18	health or have has experience in health sciences; sciences, appointed by		
19	the Governor.		
20	(3) One who shall, who, at the time of appointment, be is actively		
21	connected with or have had has experience in agriculture; agriculture,		
22	appointed by the Governor.		
23	(4) One who shall, who, at the time of appointment, be is a registered		
24	engineer with specialized training and experience in water supply or

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1 (b) Members appointed by the Governor shall serve terms of office of six 2 years. The term of office of members of the Commission is four years. Any appointment 3 to fill a vacancy on the Commission created by the resignation, dismissal, death or 4 disability of a member shall be for the balance of the unexpired term. The Governor 5 appointing authority may reappoint a member of the Commission to an additional term 6 if, at the time of the reappointment, the member qualifies for membership on the 7 Commission under subsection (a) of this section. Upon the expiration of a term, a 8 member may continue to serve until a successor is appointed and duly qualified as 9 provided by G.S. 128-7. The term of members appointed under subdivisions (1), (5), (9), (13), and (17) of subsection (a) of this section expire on 1 July of years that follow 10 11 by one year those years that are evenly divisible by four. The term of members 12 appointed under subdivisions (2), (6), (10), and (14) of subsection (a) of this section expire on 1 July of years that precede by one year those years that are evenly divisible 13 by four. The term of members appointed under subdivisions (3), (7), (11), and (15) of 14 subsection (a) of this section expire on 1 July of years that follow by two years those 15 years that are evenly divisible by four. The term of members appointed under 16 subdivisions (4), (8), (12), and (16) of subsection (a) of this section expire on 1 July of 17 those years that are evenly divisible by four. 18 19 The Governor shall have the power to may remove any member of the (b1) 20 Commission from office for misfeasance, malfeasance, or nonfeasance in accordance 21 with the provisions of G.S. 143B-13 of the Executive Organization Act of 1973.as 22 provided in G.S. 143B-13 23 (b2) The members of the Commission shall receive per diem and necessary travel 24 and subsistence expenses in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 138-5. 25 A majority of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of (b3) 26 business. 27 All clerical and other services required by the Commission shall be supplied (b4)28 by the Secretary of Environment and Natural Resources. 29 (c) Nine-Two of the members appointed by the Governor under this section and 30 all of the members appointed by the General Assembly shall be persons who do not derive any significant portion of their income from persons subject to permits or 31 32 enforcement orders under this Chapter. who engage in any activity this is regulated by 33 the Commission. The Governor shall require adequate disclosure of potential conflicts 34 of interest by members. The Governor, by executive order, shall promulgate criteria 35 regarding conflicts of interest and disclosure thereof for determining the eligibility of 36 persons under this section, giving due regard to the requirements of federal legislation, and for this purpose may promulgate rules, regulations or guidelines in conformance 37 38 with those established by any federal agency interpreting and applying provisions of 39 federal law. 40 (d) In addition to the members designated by subsection (a) of this section, the 41 General Assembly shall appoint four members, two upon the recommendation of the

42 Speaker of the House of Representatives, and two upon the recommendation of the

1	President Pro T	empore of the Senate. Appointments by the General Assembly shall be			
2	made in accordance with G.S. 120-121, and vacancies in those appointments shall be				
3	filled in accordance with G.S. 120-122. Members appointed by the General Assembly				
4	shall serve terms of two years.				
5	(e) In making appointments to the Commission, the appointing authorities shall				
6	ensure that the geographic regions of the State are fairly represented by the membership				
7	of the Commission."				
8	SECTION 2. In order to provide for an orderly transition in membership of				
9	the Environmental Management Commission and implementation of a system of				
10	staggered terms of four years for members of the Commission as specified in G.S.				
11	143B-283, as amended by Section 1 of this act, and in order that the terms of persons				
12		inted to serve as members of the Commission prior to 1 July 2001 will			
13		y the implementation of this act, the following provisions apply:
