January 30, 2001 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR OSTEOPOROSIS AWARENESS AND 3 EDUCATION ACTIVITIES. 4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: There is appropriated from the General Fund to the SECTION 1.(a) 5 Department of Health and Human Services, the sum of three hundred thousand dollars 6 (\$300,000) for the 2001-2002 fiscal year and the sum of three hundred thousand dollars 7 (\$300,000) for the 2002-2003 fiscal year. These funds shall be used to implement the 8 following recommendations of the Osteoporosis Prevention Task Force: 9 Increase public awareness and education about osteoporosis, its 10 (1) the importance of early diagnosis 11 and appropriate management, and effective prevention strategies. 12 Increase osteoporosis education and outreach to diverse population 13 (2) groups in North Carolina. 14 Increase health and human services professionals' understanding of 15 (3) osteoporosis, its impact, the importance and skill required for early 16 17 diagnosis and appropriate management and effective treatment strategies. 18 Provide access to knowledge on the prevalence, diagnosis, treatment 19 (4) and prevention of osteoporosis. 20 Improve the diagnosis, treatment and prevention abilities of health and 21 (5) human services professionals. 22 Reduce barriers to diagnosis, treatment and prevention of osteoporosis 23 (6) 24

for all North Carolina citizens.

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Monitor the burden of illness and progress toward preventing (7) osteoporosis in North Carolina citizens.

1	(8) Evaluate education and awareness, as well as efforts to improve
2	diagnosis, treatment and prevention of osteoporosis.
3	SECTION 1.(b) Funds appropriated in this section shall also be used to
4	establish two positions to implement this program.
5	SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2001.
