6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
7	SECTION 1. Section 1 of Chapter 167 of the 1993 Session Laws reads as
8	rewritten:
9	"Section 1.(a) The Charlotte-Mecklenburg Board of Education shall be elected on
10	a nonpartisan plurality election and runoff election basis on the Tuesday after the first
11	Monday in November in odd-numbered years, with the on:
12	(1) The date provided by G.S. 163-279(a)(2) if any municipality in the
13	county conducts its elections on a partisan basis, or
14	(2) The date provided by G.S. 163-279(a)(4) if no municipality in the
15	county conducts its elections on a partisan basis.
16	(b) The results shall be determined as provided by G.S. 163-292. G.S. 163-293,
17	except that a forty percent (40%) substantial plurality is required rather than a majority.
18	The rules provided in G.S. 163-111 for determining substantial plurality shall apply.
19	(c) Notwithstanding G.S. 163-279(a), if any municipality in the county conducts
20	its election on a partisan basis:
21	(1) Any municipality in the county which conducts its election on a
22	nonpartisan primary basis shall have the nonpartisan primary on the
23	sixth Tuesday before the election;
24	(2) Any municipality in the county which conducts its election on a

nonpartisan election and runoff election basis shall have the election

on the sixth Tuesday before the Tuesday after the first Monday in

- (d) Except as otherwise provided by this act, the election shall be administered in accordance with Articles 23 and 24 of Chapter 163 of the General Statutes."
- 3 **SECTION 2.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
