<b>SECTION 1.</b> Article 1 of Chapter 143 of the General Statutes is	amended by
adding a new section to read:	•
"§ 143-23.3. Salary reserve revisions.	
(a) The following definitions apply in this section:	
(1) Salary reserve. — The dollar amount created when a	a position is
downgraded or filled at a salary amount less than the amo	ount at which
it was previously budgeted (exclusive of hiring rate).	
(2) <u>Multiple individual position classifications.—Three or mo</u>	<u>re individual</u>
position classifications.	
(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any proposed emp	
increases to be funded from salary reserves as defined under this section	-
individual State agency as categorized under G.S. 143-28, that may cause	
salary increase for all positions in a single position classification, or (ii)	
wide salary increases across multiple individual position classifications,	
granted until the Director of the Budget has first consulted with the Join	
Commission on Governmental Operations. The requirements of this subsection	
apply to proposed employee salary increases to be funded out of salary	
faculty positions at the constituent institutions of The University of No	orth Carolina
System.	
(c) Salary reserve may be used only for the following:	.•
(1) To increase the salary of other positions due to p	romotion or
reclassification.	

To fill a position at a salary higher than that at which the position was

vacated.

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1	(3) To create a new position provided the position is first approved by an
2	act of the General Assembly.
3	(d) Salary reserve may be transferred only to permanent salary lines of like
4	funding source (i.e. general fund, receipts, or highway fund)."
5	<b>SECTION 2.</b> This act is effective when it becomes law.
