1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED
2	AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE JOINT LEGISLATIVE COMMISSION ON
3	PROMOTING PATIENT SAFETY IN THE PROVISION OF HEALTH CARE.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	<b>SECTION 1.(a)</b> Commission Established. – There is established the Joint
6	Legislative Study Commission on Promoting Patient Safety in the Provision of Health
7	Care. The mission of The Commission is to bring representatives from all aspects of
8	health care together to hold open and comprehensive discussions about issues affecting
9	patient safety in the delivery of health care.
10	<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> Membership. – The Commission shall consist of 25
11	members as follows:
12	(1) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate shall appoint 11 members:
13	five from the Senate and one representative from each of the
14	following:
15	a. The North Carolina Medical Society
16	b. The North Carolina Hospital Association
17	c. The North Carolina Nurses Association
18	d. Health Insurers
19	e. The North Carolina Association of Pharmacists
20	f. A retired superior court judge who is not currently a sitting
21	judge but who has experience presiding over civil litigation in
22	this State, recommended by the North Carolina Bar Association
23	(2) The Speakers of the House of Representatives shall appoint 11
24 25	members: five from the House of Representatives and one
25 26	representative from each of the following:
26	a. The North Carolina Medical Society
27	b. The North Carolina Hospital Association

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1	c. Pharmaceutical Research and Manufacturers of America, Inc.,
2	its local affiliates or a comparable professional association
3	located in this State
4	d. Managed Care Organizations
5	e. Association of Community Pharmacists, Inc.
6	f. A retired superior court judge who is not currently a sitting
7	judge but who has experience presiding over civil litigation in
8	this State, recommended by the North Carolina Academy of
9	Trial Lawyers
10	(3) The Governor shall appoint three members who represent patient
11	advocacy and consumer organizations and are not practicing attorneys.
12	<b>SECTION 1.(c)</b> Duties. – The Commission shall study current activities
13	being conducted by hospitals and other health care providers to address patient safety in
14	the provision of health care in this State, and shall determine the actions that should be
15	taken, including legislative actions and collaboration among agencies and other
16	individuals and entities, to substantially enhance and promote patient safety.
17	<b>SECTION 1.(d)</b> Reports. – The Commission shall submit a final written
18	report of its findings and recommendations to the General Assembly not later than the
19	convening of the 2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General Assembly. The
20	Commission may submit a progress report to the 2005 General Assembly upon its
21	convening. The reports shall also include legislative proposals necessary to implement
22	the Commission's recommendations and an analysis of the fiscal impact of each
23	recommendation. The Commission shall terminate upon the earlier of the filing of its
24	final report.
25	<b>SECTION 1.(e)</b> Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission shall
26	be paid per diem, subsistence, and travel expenses as follows:
27	(1) Commission members who are members of the General Assembly
28	shall be paid in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1.
29	(2) Commission members who are officials or employees of the State or
30	local government agencies shall be paid in accordance with
31	G.S. 138-6.
32	(3) All other Commission members shall be paid in accordance with
33	G.S. 138-5.
34	SECTION 1.(f) Cochairs; Meetings. – The Speakers of the House of
35	Representatives shall appoint a cochair, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate
36	shall appoint a cochair for the Commission from their respective appointees. The
37	Commission shall meet upon the call of the chairs. A majority of the Commission
38	members shall constitute a quorum. The Commission may meet during a regular or
39	special session of the General Assembly, subject to the approval of the President Pro
40	Tempore of the Senate and the Speakers of the House of Representatives. The
41	Legislative Services Commission may provide meeting space to the Commission in the
42	State Legislative Building or in the Legislative Office Building.

1 **SECTION 1.(g)** Staff. – With the prior approval of the Legislative Services 2 Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional staff to assist in 3 the work of the Commission. 4 SECTION 1.(h) Cooperation by Government Agencies. – The Commission may call upon any department, agency, institution, or officer of the State or any political 5 6 subdivision of the State for facilities, data, or other assistance. All State departments and 7 agencies, local governments, and their subdivisions shall cooperate with the 8 Commission and, upon request, shall furnish the Commission and its staff any 9 information in their possession or available to them. 10 **SECTION 2.** From funds appropriated to the General Assembly, the Legislative Services Commission shall allocate fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for the 11

12 expenses of the Commission established by this act.

13 **SECTION 3.** This act becomes effective July 1, 2004.
