2	AN ACT EXPANDING THE PURPOSES FOR WHICH COUNTIES MAY USE
3	MONEY FROM THE EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SYSTEM FUND.
4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
5	SECTION 1. G.S. 62A-8 reads as rewritten:
6	"§ 62A-8. Payments from Fund.
7	(a) Money from the Emergency Telephone System Fund shall be used only to
8	pay for:
9	(1) The lease, purchase, or maintenance of emergency telephone
10	equipment, including necessary computer hardware, software and
11	database provisioning, addressing, and nonrecurring costs of
12	establishing a 911 system, and communications equipment associated
13	with receiving, processing, or dispatching emergency calls for law
14	enforcement, fire, medical, rescue, or other public safety services;
15	addressing; and nonrecurring costs of establishing a 911 system.
16	(2) The rates associated with the service supplier's 911 service and other
17	service supplier recurring charges.
18	(b) The following expenses are not eligible for payment from the Fund: the lease
19	or purchase of real estate, cosmetic remodeling of emergency dispatch centers, hiring,
20	training, and compensating dispatchers, and the purchase of mobile communications
21	vehicles, ambulances, fire engines, or other emergency vehicles.
22	(c) A local government may contract with a service supplier for any term
23	negotiated by the service supplier and the local government and may make payments
24	from the Emergency Telephone System Fund to provide any payments required by the
25	contract."
26	SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
