A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ENSURE THAT LOW-WEALTH 3 SCHOOLS HAVE THE RESOURCES TO RETAIN EXCELLENT TEACHERS.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

5 **SECTION 1.(a)** There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Public Instruction the sum of thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) for the 6 2005-2006 fiscal year and the sum of thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) for the 7 8 2006-2007 fiscal year to ensure that local school administrative units in low-wealth 9 counties have the resources to retain excellent teachers. The State Board of Education 10 shall allocate these funds to local school administrative units located in counties for 11 which the county wealth is eighty percent or less of the State average wealth, as computed under the funding formula for low-wealth county supplemental funding. 12

Allocations shall be adjusted for local effort in accordance with the funding
 formula for low-wealth county supplemental funding.

SECTION 1.(b) The State Board of Education shall allocate funds to each 15 16 such local school administrative unit to increase the unit's average local teacher salary 17 supplement from the percentage of salary paid by the unit for the 2004-2005 school year to the average percentage of salary paid by the large urban metropolitan units in the 18 State for the 2004-2005 school year. A local school administrative unit shall receive 19 20 these funds only after fifty percent of any low-wealth county supplemental funding and disadvantaged student supplemental funding received by the unit has been spent for this 21 22 purpose.

The large urban metropolitan units in the State are the Durham County, Wake
County, Orange County, Chapel Hill-Carrboro City, Charlotte-Mecklenburg County,
Buncombe County, Asheville City, New Hanover County, Winston-Salem/Forsyth
County, and Guilford County School Administrative Units.

Local school administrative units shall use these funds only for salary supplements to retain teachers.

SECTION 2. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
