2	AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO ESTABLISH THE NORTH CAROLINA
3	VITICULTURE AND ENOLOGY CENTER ON THE CAMPUS OF SURRY
4	COMMUNITY COLLEGE.
5	Whereas, grape growing has proven to be a viable agricultural alternative,
6	yielding a profit margin comparable with tobacco; and
7	Whereas, Surry Community College offers a degree, diploma, and certificate
8	in viticulture/enology and provides the only two-year degree program on the East Coast;
9	and
10	Whereas, Surry Community College provides applied research,
11	demonstration, consultation, evaluation, technical support, and workforce development
12	for vineyard and winery owners; and
13	Whereas, Surry Community College is located in the center of the Yadkin
14	Valley Appellation, the only designated American Viticulture Area in North Carolina;
15	and
16	Whereas, plans have been made to establish the North Carolina Center for
17	Viticulture and Enology on the campus of Surry Community College; and
18	Whereas, the North Carolina Viticulture and Enology Center will house a
19	state-of-the-art bonded winery for producing quality wines, classrooms, offices, a
20	resource library, a climate-controlled wine cellar, and an auditorium for seminars,
21	conventions, and conferences; and
22	Whereas, the North Carolina Viticulture and Enology Center will serve as a
23	teaching laboratory and demonstration model for the wine industry; Now, therefore,
24	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
25	SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North
26	Carolina Community Colleges System Office the sum of seven million five hundred
27	thousand dollars (\$7,500,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to establish the North
28	Carolina Center for Viticulture and Enology on the campus of Surry Community
29	College.
