#### A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO ENABLE RETIRED SCHOOL PRINCIPALS, ASSISTANT PRINCIPALS, AND CENTRAL OFFICE ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL TO RETURN TO EMPLOYMENT WITH THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS WITHOUT LOSING RETIREMENT BENEFITS.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

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## **SECTION 1.** G.S. 135-3(8)c. reads as rewritten:

Should a beneficiary who retired on an early or service 8 "c. 9 retirement allowance under this Chapter be reemployed, or 10 otherwise engaged to perform services, by an employer participating in the Retirement System on a part-time, 11 temporary, interim, or on a fee-for-service basis, whether 12 13 contractual or otherwise, and if such beneficiary earns an amount during the 12-month period immediately following the 14 15 effective date of retirement or in any calendar year which exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the reported compensation, 16 excluding terminal payments, during the 12 months of service 17 preceding the effective date of retirement, or twenty thousand 18 dollars (\$20,000), whichever is greater, as hereinafter indexed, 19 then the retirement allowance shall be suspended as of the first 20 day of the month following the month in which the 21 reemployment earnings exceed the amount above, for the 22 balance of the calendar year. The retirement allowance of the 23 beneficiary shall be reinstated as of January 1 of each year 24 following suspension. The amount that may be earned before 25 suspension shall be increased on January 1 of each year by the 26 ratio of the Consumer Price Index to the Index one year earlier, 27 calculated to the nearest tenth of a percent (1/10 of 1%). 28

 The computation of postretirement earnings of a beneficiary under this sub-subdivision, G.S. 135-3(8)c., who has been retired at least six months and has not been employed in any capacity with a public school for at least six months immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment, shall not include earnings while the beneficiary is employed to teach in a permanent full-time or part-time capacity that exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the applicable workweek in a public school. The Department of Public Instruction shall certify to the Retirement System that a beneficiary is employed to teach by a local school administrative unit under the provisions of this sub-subdivision and as a retired teacher or school administrative personnel as the term is defined under the provisions of G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a).

Beneficiaries employed under this sub-subdivision are not entitled to any benefits otherwise provided under this Chapter as a result of this period of employment."

### **SECTION 2.** G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a) reads as rewritten:

- "(5a) "Retired teacher"teacher or administrative personnel" means a beneficiary of the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System of North Carolina whowho:
  - a. Was previously employed as a teacher, principal, assistant principal, or as central office administrative personnel,
  - b. has Has been retired at least six months,
  - <u>c.</u> <u>hasHas</u> not been employed in any capacity for at least six months, immediately preceding the effective date of reemployment,
  - <u>d.</u> <u>isIs</u> determined by a local board of education or a charter school to have had satisfactory performance during the last year of employment by a local board of education or a charter school, and
  - <u>e.</u> <u>who Who</u> is employed <del>to teach</del> as provided in G.S. 135-3(8)c.

A retired teacher at a school other than a charter school shall be treated the same as a probationary teacher except that (i) a retired teacher is not eligible for career status and (ii) the performance of a retired teacher who had attained career status prior to retirement shall be evaluated in accordance with a local board of education's policies and procedures applicable to career teachers."

### **SECTION 3.** G.S. 115C-316(d) reads as rewritten:

"(d) A local board of education may pay a retired teacher, teachers and retired school administrative personnel, as that term is those terms are defined in G.S. 115C 325(a)(5a) G.S. 115C-325(a)(5a), no more than the employee employees would have received on the teacher appropriate salary schedule, excluding longevity, had the employee employees not retired."

**SECTION 4.** Notwithstanding any other provision of law, each local school administrative unit shall pay to the Teachers' and State Employees' Retirement System a Reemployed Teacher Contribution Rate of eleven and seventy-hundredths percent (11.70%) as a percentage of covered salaries that the retired professional educators, who are exempt from the earnings cap, are being paid. Each local school administrative unit shall report monthly to the Retirement Systems Division on payments made pursuant to this section.

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Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any portion of the payment made by a local school administrative unit to a reemployed professional educator who is exempt from the earnings cap, consisting of salary plus the Reemployed Teacher Contribution Rate, that exceeds the State-supported salary level for that position, shall be paid from local funds.

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**SECTION 5.** This act becomes effective June 30, 2006.
