4	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> Section 1.1 of S.L. 2004-179, as amended by S.L. 2005-276,			
6	reads as rewritten:			
7	"SECTION 1.1. In accordance with G.S. 142-83, this section authorizes the			
8	issuance or incurrence of special indebtedness in the following maximum aggregate			
9	principal amounts to finance the costs of the following projects. The table below			
10	provides the maximum principal amounts. The first column is the aggregate maximum			
11	principal amount. The second column is the maximum portion of this amount that can			
12	be issued or incurred before July 1, 2005. The State, with the prior approval of the State			
13	Treasurer and the Council of State, as provided in Article 9 of Chapter 142 of the			
14	General Statutes, is authorized to issue or incur special indebtedness in order to provide			
15	funds to the State	to be used, together	with other available funds, to pay the cost of these	
16	projects.
