1	A BILL TO BE ENTITLED		
2	AN ACT TO EXPAND THE EXISTING TUITION WAIVER PROGRAM AND TO		
3	PROVIDE AN EXCEPTION TO THE TWELVE-MONTH RESIDENCY		
4	REQUIREMENT FOR CERTAIN UNIVERSITY OF NORTH CAROLINA		
5	EMPLOYEES AND THEIR CHILDREN.		
6	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
7	SECTION 1. G.S. 116-143 reads as rewritten:		
8	"§ 116-143. State-supported institutions of higher education required to charge		
9	tuition and fees.		
10	(a) The Board of Governors of the University of North Carolina shall fix the		
11	tuition and fees, not inconsistent with actions of the General Assembly, at the		
12	institutions enumerated in G.S. 116-4 in such amount or amounts as it may deem best,		
13	taking into consideration the nature of each institution and program of study and the		
14	cost of equipment and maintenance; and each institution shall charge and collect from		
15	each student, at the beginning of each semester or quarter, tuition, fees, and an amount		
16	sufficient to pay other expenses for the term.		
17	(b) In the event that said students are unable to pay the cost of tuition and		
18	required academic fees as the same may become due, in cash, the said several boards of		
19	trustees are hereby authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to accept the		
20	obligation of the student or students together with such collateral or security as they		
21	may deem necessary and proper, it being the purpose of this Article that all students in		
22	State institutions of higher learning shall be required to pay tuition, and that free tuition		
23	is hereby abolished.		
24	(c) Inasmuch as the giving of tuition and fee waivers, or especially reduced rates,		
25	represent in effect a variety of scholarship awards, the said practice is hereby prohibited		
26	except when expressly authorized by statute or by the Board of Governors of the		
27	University of North Carolina; and, furthermore, it is hereby directed and required that		
28	all budgeted funds expended for scholarships of any type must be clearly identified in		
29	budget reports.

1	(d) Notw	ithstanding the above provision relating to the abolition of free tuition,	
2	the Board of Governors of the University of North Carolina may, in its discretion,		
3	discretion, do the following:		
4	<u>(1)</u>	provide Provide regulations under which a full-time faculty member of	
5		the rank of full-time instructor or above, and any full-time staff	
6		member of the University of North Carolina may during the period of	
7		normal employment enroll for not more than <u>one course</u> three courses	
8		per semester_academic year in the University of North Carolina free of	
9		charge for tuition, provided such enrollment does not interfere with	
10		normal employment obligations and further provided that such	
11		enrollments are not counted for the purpose of receiving general fund	
12	(2)	appropriations.	
13	<u>(2)</u>	Provide regulations under which the spouse and one or more	
14 15		dependent children of a full-time faculty member of the rank of full time instructor or above or the spouse and one or more dependent	
15 16		<u>full-time instructor or above or the spouse and one or more dependent</u> children of a full-time staff member of The University of North	
10		Carolina may have the spouse's or dependent children's tuition reduced	
17		by twenty-five percent (25%) so long as the faculty member of the	
10 19		rank of full-time instructor or above, or staff member remains	
20		employed full-time at The University of North Carolina."	
21	SEC	FION 2. G.S. 116-143.1 is amended by adding a new subsection to	
22	read:		
23		ithstanding subsection (b) of this section, a person who is a full-time	
24	faculty member of the rank of full-time instructor or above or a full-time staff member		
25	of The University of North Carolina, or is the spouse or dependent child of such		
26	full-time faculty member of the rank of full-time instructor or above or full-time staff		
27	member of The University of North Carolina, and who is a legal resident of North		
28	Carolina, qualifies as a resident for tuition purposes without having maintained that		
29	legal residence for at least 12 months immediately prior to his or her classification as a		
30	resident for tuit	ion purposes."	
31	SEC	FION 3. The Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina	
32	and the State Board of Community Colleges shall study the feasibility of a tuition		
33	waiver exchange program under which full-time employees of The University of North		
34	Carolina would be allowed to take a specified number of courses at a community		
35	college without paying tuition, and full-time employees of a community college would		
36	be allowed to take a specified number of courses at The University of North Carolina		
37		tuition. The Boards shall report the results of this study to the Joint	
38	-	cation Oversight Committee by April 1, 2006.	
39	SEC.	FION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law.
