The North Carolina Lottery Commission shall publish on its Web site information 11 12 requested by the Committee to be posted. Reports. – The Committee shall report semiannually to the Joint Legislative 13 (d) 14 Commission on Governmental Operations. 15 Organization. – The President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall each designate a cochair of the Committee. The 16 17 Committee shall meet at least once a quarter upon the joint call of the cochairs. A 18 quorum of the Committee is six members. No action may be taken except by a majority vote at a meeting at which a quorum is present. 19
 - <u>(f)</u> Funding. From funds available to the General Assembly, the Legislative Services Commission shall allocate monies to fund the work of the Committee. Members of the Committee receive subsistence and travel expenses as provided in G.S. 120-3.1 and G.S. 138-5.
 - (g) Staff. The Legislative Services Commission, through the Legislative Services Officer, shall assign professional staff to assist the Committee in its work. Upon the direction of the Legislative Services Commission, the Supervisors of Clerks of the Senate and of the House of Representatives shall assign clerical staff to the Committee. The expenses for clerical employees shall be borne by the Committee."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law.
