SECTION 4. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of seventy-eight thousand five hundred forty-eight dollars (\$78,548) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to establish the additional district court judgeship for District Court District 14 authorized by this act.

SECTION 5. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Judicial Department the sum of two hundred fifty-four thousand eighty-eight dollars (\$254,088) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to establish the three additional assistant district attorney positions for Prosecutorial District 14 authorized by this act.

SECTION 6. Section 1 of this act becomes effective January 15, 2007. The remainder of this act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
