1	<b>SECTION 3.</b> Quorum. – A quorum of the Commission shall consist of 12		
2	members.		
3	<b>SECTION 4.</b> Vacancies. – Any vacancy on the Commission shall be filled		
4	by the original appointing authority.		
5	SECTION 5. Purpose and Duties. – The Commission shall study the		
6	feasibility of using school buses, school activity buses, Department of Correction buses,		
7	or buses belonging to any other State agency or local government to transport Mexican		
8	nationals found within the State of North Carolina who are not lawfully present in the		
9	United States back to Mexico. The study shall also examine the proper means of		
10	reimbursing the use of the buses, carrying proper liability insurance, providing adequate		
11	food, beverage, and sanitation for those being transported, and making sure that the use		
12	of the buses does not interfere with the normal uses of that equipment.		
13	<b>SECTION 6.</b> Expenses of Members. – Members of the Commission shall		
14	receive per diem, subsistence, and travel allowances in accordance with G.S. 120-3.1,		
15	138-5, or 138-6, as appropriate.		
16	<b>SECTION 7.</b> Staff. – Upon the prior approval of the Legislative Services		
17	Commission, the Legislative Services Officer shall assign professional staff to the		
18	Commission to aid in its work.		
19	<b>SECTION 8.</b> Consultants. – The Commission may hire consultants to assist		
20	with the study as provided in G.S. 120-32.02(b).		
21	<b>SECTION 9.</b> Meetings. – The Commission may meet in the Legislative		
22	Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of the Legislative		
23	Services Commission.		
24	<b>SECTION 10.</b> Report. – The Commission shall report its findings and		
25	recommendations to the General Assembly on or before January 1, 2007, at which time		
26	the Commission shall terminate.		
27	<b>SECTION 11.</b> Funding. – There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Assembly the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$20,000) for the 2006 2007		
28 29	the General Assembly the sum of thirty thousand dollars (\$30,000) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year for the purpose of conducting the study provided for in this act.		
29 30	SECTION 12. Effective Date. – This act becomes effective July 1, 2006.
