Referred to: Appropriations/Base Budget. March 7, 2005 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE MID-EASTERN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE (MEAC) FOR SCHOLARSHIPS. Whereas, the 2006 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Basketball Tournament is projected to generate \$1,000,000 in tax revenues; and Whereas, projected State and local sales tax will total \$800,000; and Whereas, projected hotel occupancy tax will total \$135,000; and Whereas, projected prepared food and beverage taxes will total \$27,000 for people in hotels and \$15,000 for people not in hotels; and

10 Whereas, the MEAC Basketball Tournament is expected to attract graduates 11 of the following institutions: Howard University, Washington, DC; Morgan State 12 University, Baltimore, MD; Hampton University, Hampton, VA; North Carolina A & T 13 State University, Greensboro, NC; Florida A & M University, Tallahassee, FL; Bethune-Cookman College, Daytona Beach, FL; South Carolina State University, 14 15 Orangeburg, SC; Coppin State University, Baltimore, MD; Delaware State University, 16 Dover, DE; and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, Princess Anne, MD; and Whereas, the number of persons projected to attend the tournament is 17 18 100,000; and

Whereas, the projected total number of room nights that will sell is 26,000 inWake and Durham counties; and

Whereas, the projected number of total visitor spending is \$12,000,000; Now,
therefore,

23 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of Commerce the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to be allocated to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) for student scholarships.
