Services Officer shall assign professional and clerical staff to assist in the work of the Commission. Clerical staff shall be furnished to the Commission through the offices of

the House of Representatives and Senate Supervisors of Clerks. The Commission may 1 2 meet in the Legislative Building or the Legislative Office Building upon the approval of 3 the Legislative Services Commission. The Commission, while in discharge of official 4 duties, may exercise all the powers provided under the provisions of G.S. 120-19 5 through G.S. 120-19.4, including the power to request all officers, agents, agencies, and 6 departments of the State to provide any information, data, or documents within their 7 possession, ascertainable from their records, or otherwise available to them, and the 8 power to subpoena witnesses. Members of the Commission shall receive per diem, 9 subsistence, and travel allowances at the rate established in G.S. 120-3.1. The 10 appointing authority shall fill vacancies.

SECTION 2.(b) The Commission shall submit a final report to the 2006 Regular Session of the 2005 General Assembly and shall terminate upon filing its final report.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the General Assembly the sum of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year for the costs of the work of the Study Commission created in Section 1 of this act.

SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
