9	SECT	FION 1. Article 25 of Chapter 7B of the General Statutes is amended
10	by adding a new	v section to read:
11	" <u>§ 7B-2513.1.</u> 1	Escape from and failure to return to custody of the Department.
12	(a) When	a juvenile committed to the Department pursuant to this Article
13	-	npts to escape the custody of the Department or fails to return to the
14	•	Department, the court, upon motion of the Department or upon the
15		otion, and after hearing, may extend the term of the juvenile's
16	commitment. Th	
17	<u>(1)</u>	Shall have reasonable notice in writing of the nature and content of the
18		allegations in the motion, including notice that the purpose of the
19		hearing is to determine whether the juvenile has escaped or attempted
20		to escape the custody of the Department or has failed to return to the
21		custody of the Department pursuant to the terms of conditional release
22		when the juvenile has been released on a conditional or temporary
23		basis;
24	<u>(2)</u>	Shall be represented by an attorney at the hearing;
25	<u>(3)</u>	Shall have the right to confront and cross-examine witnesses; and
26	<u>(4)</u>	May admit, deny, or explain the violation alleged and may present
27		proof, including affidavits or other evidence, in support of the
28		juvenile's contentions. A record of the proceeding shall be made and
29		preserved in the juvenile's record.

1	(b) If the court determines by the greater weight of the evidence that the juvenile
2	has escaped or attempted to escape the custody of the Department or has failed to return
3	to the custody of the Department, the court may order the term of the juvenile's
4	commitment to the Department be extended for a period of at least 90 days and no more
5	than 180 days.
6	(c) Notwithstanding G.S. 7B-2516, pursuant to this section, the juvenile may
7	remain committed to the Department up to 90 days past:
8	(1) The juvenile's nineteenth birthday if the juvenile has been committed
9	to the Department for an offense that would be a Class B1, B2, C, D,
10	or E felony if committed by an adult, other than an offense set forth in
11	<u>G.S. 7B-1602(a).</u>
12	(2) The juvenile's eighteenth birthday if the juvenile has been committed
13	to the Department for an offense other than an offense that would be a
14	Class A, B1, B2, C, D, or E felony if committed by an adult.
15	(d) The Department shall modify the plan of care or treatment developed
16	pursuant to G.S. 7B-2513(f) to incorporate the order of the court pursuant to this section
17	and to state the specific course of treatment or care that will be implemented to
18	rehabilitate the juvenile and ensure the safety and well-being of the public.
19	(e) This section applies to juveniles housed in county facilities or placed in
20	county programs by the Department as well as to juveniles housed in State facilities or
21	placed in State programs."
22	SECTION 2. Article 33 of Chapter 14 of the General Statutes is amended by
23	adding a new section to read:
24	" <u>§ 14-256.2. Escape from and failure to return to custody of the Department of</u>
25	Juvenile Justice and Delinguency Prevention.
26	It is unlawful for any person to aid or assist any other person from escaping or
27	attempting to escape from the custody of the Department of Juvenile Justice and
28	Delinquency Prevention. Violation of this section is a Class 1 misdemeanor."
29	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective December 1, 2005, and applies to
30	violations and offenses committed on or after that date.
