A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS FOR NEW POSITIONS NEEDED TO ASSIST THE NORTH CAROLINA INDUSTRIAL COMMISSION TO ENSURE THAT THE COMMISSION HAS ADEQUATE RESOURCES.

The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina Industrial Commission the sum of one hundred fifty-two thousand one hundred ninety-four dollars (\$152,194) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to establish and support two Administrative Officer II (workers' compensation fraud investigator) positions and two Program Assistant V positions and the sum of one hundred fifty-two thousand one hundred ninety-four dollars (\$152,194) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to continue and support these positions.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina Industrial Commission the sum of one hundred sixty-one thousand six hundred seventy-two dollars (\$161,672) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to establish and support two Administrative Officer II (ombudsman) positions, one Program Assistant V position, and one Receptionist III position and the sum of one hundred sixty-one thousand six hundred seventy-two dollars (\$161,672) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to continue and support these positions.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the General Fund to the North Carolina Industrial Commission the sum of two hundred thousand seven hundred ninety-five dollars (\$200,795) for the 2005-2006 fiscal year to establish and support four Industrial Safety Rep II positions and one Program Assistant V position and the sum of two hundred thousand seven hundred ninety-five dollars (\$200,795) for the 2006-2007 fiscal year to continue and support these positions.

SECTION 4. This act becomes effective July 1, 2005.
