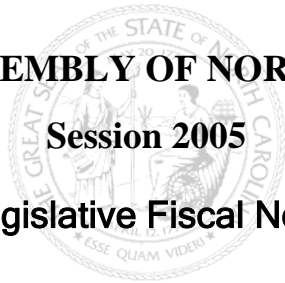

**BILL SUMMARY:** The bill requires 1) the drivers license applicant to sign a pledge stating: "I will not litter" and 2) for those words to appear on the drivers license above the signature.

**ASSUMPTIONS AND METHODOLOGY:** The requirement that applicants sign a pledge can be implemented essentially without cost. The requirement that the words appear on the drivers license above the signature would require a reconfiguration of printers at each drivers license office, by the digitized license vendor, at a one-time cost to DMV of \$33,700.

It is assumed that the inclusion of the pledge does not lengthen the time it takes to complete a transaction (for questions, explanations, etc.).

**SOURCES OF DATA:** Division of Motor Vehicles

**TECHNICAL CONSIDERATIONS:** DMV would require at least 60 days from the time of the bill's passage to implement its requirements. The time would be used to print and distribute new signature cards and to reconfigure the printers.
