April 18, 2007 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CLARIFY THE DEFINITION OF FARMER FOR PURPOSES OF APPLYING THE SALES AND USE TAX EXEMPTION TO ITEMS SOLD TO FARMERS AND TO EXPAND THE EXEMPTION TO INCLUDE ITEMS SOLD TO LESSORS OF FARMLAND. The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: SECTION 1. G.S. 105-164.3 is amended by adding a new subdivision to read: "(9a) Farmer. — A dairy operator, poultry farmer, egg producer, Christmas tree farmer, livestock farmer, crop farmer, tree farmer, nursery operator, greenhouse operator, orchardist, a farmer of an aquatic species as defined in G.S. 106-758, and any other person coming within the generally accepted definition of the word. Farmer does not include a person who merely cultivates a garden for personal use." SECTION 2. G.S. 105-164.13(1) and (1a) read as rewritten: "(1) Any of the following items sold to a farmer or to a lessor of farmland who is responsible for the upkeep and maintenance of farmland for use by the farmer or by a lessor of farmland or the lessor's lessee in the planting, cultivating, harvesting, or curing of Christmas trees and farm crops or in the production of dairy products, eggs, or animals. A "farmer" includes a dairy operator, a poultry farmer, an egg producer, a livestock farmer, a farmer of crops, and a farmer of an aquatic species, as defined in G.S. 106-758. a. 14	SECTION 3. This act becomes effective January 1, 2008, and applies to
15	sales made on or after that date.
