3	TEACHERS, GUIDANCE COUNSELORS, AND COACHES BY
4	CONSOLIDATING THE FUTURE TEACHERS OF NORTH CAROLINA
5	SCHOLARSHIP LOAN FUND AND THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION -
6	COACHING SCHOLARSHIP LOAN FUND WITH THE PROSPECTIVE
7	TEACHERS SCHOLARSHIP LOAN FUND.
8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:
9	SECTION 1. G.S. 116-209.33 reads as rewritten:
10	"§ 116-209.33. Scholarship Loan Fund for Prospective Teachers.
11	(a) There is established a revolving fund known as the "Scholarship Loan Fund
12	for Prospective Teachers". The purpose of the Fund is to provide scholarship loans to
13	qualified individuals students who are pursuing college degrees or licensure to become
14	teachers.teachers or guidance counselors in the North Carolina public schools and
15	encourage some of those individuals to become coaches or assistant coaches.
16	Scholarship loans shall be available only to students who are enrolled, or accepted for
17	enrollment, in institutions of higher education located in this State that offer programs
18	that prepare students to teach in the public schools or, in the case of scholarship loans
19	for guidance counselors, that offer graduate degrees in counselor education. The State
20	Education Assistance Authority shall administer the Fund.
21	(b) The State Education Assistance Authority, in consultation with the State
22	Board of Education, Board of Governors of The University of North Carolina and the
23	State Board of Community Colleges, shall develop criteria for awarding scholarship
24	loans from the Fund. These criteria shall include:
25	(1) Measures of academic performance including grade point averages,
26	scores on standardized tests, tests as appropriate, class rank, and
27	recommendations of guidance counselors and principals.principals or
28	faculty and college administrators.

Consideration of the commitment an individual applying to 16 receive funds demonstrates to the profession of teaching. 17 (c) The State Education Assistance Authority shall earmark each year up to 25 18 scholarship loans under this section for new awards to students enrolled in teacher preparation programs that demonstrate a commitment to the profession of coaching. The 19 20 State Education Assistance Authority may earmark each year up to twenty percent 21 (20%) of the funds available for scholarship loans under this section for awards to 22 applicants for the Teacher Assistant Scholarship Fund established in G.S. 116-209.35." 23 SECTION 2. G.S. 116-209.34 reads as rewritten: 24 "§ 116-209.34. Fund administered by State Education Assistance Authority; rule-making authority. 25 26 The State Education Assistance Authority shall establish the terms and (a) 27 conditions for the scholarship loans consistent with the following: The Each scholarship loan amount shall be not exceed more than four 28 (1)29 thousand dollars (\$4,000) six thousand five hundred dollars (\$6,500) per academic school year for a maximum period of four academic 30 31 years for applicants who are pursuing a college degree to become a 32 teacher.years. 33 All scholarship loans shall be evidenced by notes made payable to the (2)34 Authority that bear interest at the rate of set by the Authority not to 35 exceed ten percent (10%) per year, beginning September 190 days 36 after graduation, or immediately after termination of the scholarship 37 loan, whichever is earlier. 38 A scholarship loan shall be terminated upon the recipient's (3) 39 withdrawing from school or a finding by the Authority that the 40 recipient fails to meet the standards set by the Authority. All 41 terminated scholarships shall be regarded as vacant and subject to 42 being awarded to other eligible persons. The Authority shall forgive a four-year loan if, within seven years after 43 (4) graduation, exclusive of any deferment authorized by the Authority on 44

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1	the basis of extenuating circumstances, the recipient teaches for four
2	years at a North Carolina public school or at a school operated by the
3	United States government in North Carolina. The Authority shall also
4	forgive a four-year loan if, within seven years after graduation,
5	exclusive of any deferment authorized by the Authority on the basis of
6	extenuating circumstances, the recipient teaches for three consecutive
7	years, or for three years interrupted only by an approved leave of
8	absence, at a North Carolina public school that is in a low-performing
9	school system or a school system on warning status at the time the
10	recipient accepts employment with the local school administrative unit.
11	For loans of less than four years, the Authority shall forgive one year
12	for each year the recipient teaches, within four years of graduation,
13	exclusive of any deferment authorized by the Authority on the basis of
14	extenuating circumstances, at a North Carolina public school or a
15	school operated by the United States government in North Carolina.
16	(5) The Authority may forgive or reduce any loan payment if the
17	Authority considers that extenuating circumstances exist that would
18	make teaching or repayment impossible.
19	(6) The Authority shall ensure that all repayments, including the accrued
20	interest, are placed in the Fund.
21	(b) The State Education Assistance Authority, in consultation with the State
22	Board of Education, Authority shall adopt rules to implement G.S. 116-209.33,
23	116-209.34, and 116-209.35.
24	(c) The State Education Assistance Authority shall: (i) prepare a clear written
25	explanation of the Scholarship Loan Fund for Prospective Teachers and the information
26	regarding the availability and criteria for awarding the scholarships; and (ii) provide that
27	information to the appropriate counselors in each local school system and appropriate
28	administrators in the institutions of higher education in the State and shall charge those
29	counselors and administrators to inform students about the scholarships and to
30	encourage them to apply for the scholarships."
31	SECTION 3. G.S. 116-209.36 and G.S. 116-209.38 are repealed effective
32	July 1, 2008.
33	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective January 1, 2008, and applies to all
34	scholarship loans awarded for academic years beginning after July 1, 2008.
