9		SECTION 1. G.S. 18B-302(c) is amended by adding a new subdivision to

11	"(c)	Aider and Abettor.
12		(1) By Underage Person. – Any person who is under the lawful age to
13		purchase and who aids or abets another in violation of subsection (a)
14		or (b) of this section shall be guilty of a Class 2 misdemeanor.
15		(2) By Person over Lawful Age. – Any person who is over the lawful age
16		to purchase and who aids or abets another in violation of subsection (a)
17		or (b) of this section shall be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
18		(3) By a Parent or Person who has Legal or Physical Custody. – Any
19		parent or person who has legal or physical custody of a person less
20		than 21 years of age and who aids or abets the person less than 21
21		years of age in violation of subsection (a) or (b) of this section shall be
22		guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall pay a fine of five hundred
23		<u>dollars (\$500.00).</u> "
24		SECTION 2. G.S. 18B-302(g) reads as rewritten:
25	"(g)	Conviction Report Sent to Division of Motor Vehicles. – The court shall file a

3	(1) A violation of subsection (e) or (f) of this section; or
4	(2) A violation of subdivision (c)(1) subsection (c) of this section; or
5	(3) A violation of subsection (b) of this section, if the violation occurred
6	while the person was purchasing or attempting to purchase an
7	alcoholic beverage.
8	Upon receipt of a conviction report, the Division shall revoke the person's license as
9	required by G.S. 20-17.3."
10	SECTION 3. G.S. 20-17.3 reads as rewritten:
11	"§ 20-17.3. Revocation for underage purchasers of alcohol.
12	The Division shall revoke for one year the driver's license of any person who has
13	been convicted of violating any of the following:
14	(1) G.S. 18B-302(c)(1),(c), (e), or (f); or
15	(2) G.S. 18B-302(b), if the violation occurred while the person was
16	purchasing or attempting to purchase an alcoholic beverage.
17	If the person's license is currently suspended or revoked, then the revocation under
18	this section shall begin at the termination of that revocation."
19	SECTION 4. This act becomes effective December 1, 2007, and applies to
20	offenses committed on or after that data
