The State Board shall publish sample employee identification cards for each 6 participating State or local government entity or charter school." 7 **SECTION 4.** Section 1.2(f) of S.L. 2018-144, as amended by S.L. 2019-4, reads as 8 rewritten: 9 "SECTION 1.2.(f) Notwithstanding G.S. 163A-1145.1, 163A-1145.2, and 163A-1145.3, 10 the State Board shall approve (i) tribal enrollment cards issued by a tribe recognized by this State 11 under Chapter 71A of the General Statutes; (ii) student identification cards issued by a constituent 12 institution of The University of North Carolina, a community college, as defined in 13 G.S. 115D-2(2), or eligible private postsecondary institution as defined in G.S. 116-280(3); and 14 (iii) employee identification cards issued by a state or local government entity, including a charter 15 school, for use as voting identification under G.S. 163A-1145.1 no later than March 15, 2019, November 1, 2019, for use in primaries and elections held in 2019 and 2020, and again no later 16 17 than May 15, 2021, for elections held on or after that date. 2020. The State Board shall adopt 18 temporary rules on reasonable security measures for use of student or employee identification 19 cards for voting identification in G.S. 163A-1145.2 and G.S. 163A-1145.3 no later than February 20 1, 2019. September 15, 2019. The State Board shall adopt permanent rules on reasonable security 21 measures for use of student or employee identification cards for voting identification in 22 G.S. 163A-1145.2 and G.S. 163A-1145.3 no later than May 15, 2021. The State Board shall 23 produce the initial list of participating institutions and employing entities no later than April 1, 24 2019. for use in primaries and elections held in 2020." 25 **SECTION 5.** Section 1.2(g) of S.L. 2018-144, as amended by S.L. 2019-4, reads as 26 rewritten: 27 "SECTION 1.2.(g) Notwithstanding G.S. 163A 1145.1, 163A 1145.2, and 163A 1145.3, 28 For elections held in 2020 only, a student identification card issued by a constituent institution 29 of The University of North Carolina, a community college, college as defined in G.S. 115D-2(2), 30 or eligible private postsecondary institution as defined in G.S. 116-280(3) or an employee 31 identification card issued by state or local government entity that does not contain an entity, 32 including a charter school, may not be denied approval under G.S. 163A-1145.2 or 33 G.S. 163A-1145.3 solely due to a lack of a printed expiration date date. Notwithstanding 34 G.S. 163A-1145.1, an approved student identification card or employee identification card 35 without a printed expiration date shall be eligible for use in any election held before January 1, 36 2021." 37 **SECTION 6.(a)** Any student identification card issued by a constituent institution 38 of The University of North Carolina, a community college as defined in G.S. 115D-2(2), or 39 eligible private postsecondary institution as defined in G.S. 116-280(3), or an employee 40 identification card issued by a State or local government entity or charter school approved by the 41 State Board of Elections on or before March 15, 2019, for use in elections held on or after January 42 1, 2019, until December 31, 2022, shall continue to be eligible for use in an election prior to 43 December 31, 2022, without further submission by the constituent institution of The University 44 of North Carolina, community college as defined in G.S. 115D-2(2), or eligible private

postsecondary institution as defined in G.S. 116-280(3), or State or local government entity or
charter school.
SECTION 6.(b) Any constituent institution of The University of North Carolina, a
community college as defined in G.S. 115D-2(2), or eligible private postsecondary institution as
defined in G.S. 116-280(3), or State or local government entity or charter school denied approval
by the State Board of Elections on or before March 15, 2019, shall be granted until November

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1 identification cards for use as voting identification under G.S. 163A-1145.1 no later than 2 December 1, 2019, for use in primaries and elections held in 2020. 3 **SECTION 7.** G.S. 163A-1303 is amended by adding a new subsection to read: 4 Notwithstanding G.S. 163A-1300 and subdivisions (c)(2) and (c)(3) of this section, a "(e) 5 county board of elections by unanimous vote of all its members may propose a Plan for 6 Implementation providing for sites in that county for absentee ballots to be applied for and cast 7 in elections conducted in odd-numbered years. The proposed Plan for Implementation shall 8 specify the hours of operation for the county board of elections for an election conducted in that 9 county for that odd-numbered year. If the county board of elections is unable to reach unanimity 10 in favor of a Plan for Implementation for that odd-numbered year, a member or members of the 11 county board of elections may petition the State Board to adopt a Plan for Implementation for the county, and the State Board may adopt a Plan for Implementation for that county. However, 12 throughout the period required by G.S. 163A-1300(b), any Plan of Implementation approved 13 14 under this subsection shall provide for a minimum of regular business hours consistent with daily 15 hours presently observed by the county board of elections for the county board of elections, or 16 its alternate, and for uniform locations, days, and hours for all other additional one-stop sites in 17 that county." 18 SECTION 7.5.(a) G.S. 163A-1303(d)(1), (2), (3), and (4) are recodified as 19 G.S. 163A-1303(d)(1)a., b., c., and d. 20 SECTION 7.5.(b) G.S. 163A-1303(d), as amended by this section, reads as 21 rewritten: 22 "(d) Notwithstanding subsection (c) of this section, a county board of elections by 23 unanimous vote of all its members may propose a Plan for Implementation providing for a site 24 the number of sites set out below in that county for absentee ballots to be applied for and cast 25 with days and hours that vary from the county board of elections, or its alternate, and other 26 additional one-stop sites in that county. If the county board of elections is unable to reach 27 unanimity in favor of a Plan for Implementation, a member or members of the county board of 28 elections may petition the State Board to adopt a plan for the county and the State Board may 29 adopt a Plan for Implementation for that county. However, any Plan of Implementation approved 30 under this subsection shall provide for uniform location, days, and hours for that one site 31 throughout the period required by subsection (a) of this section. G.S. 163A-1300(b). This 32 subsection applies only to a county which includes a barrier island that meets any of the following 33 conditions: following: 34 One site in a county that includes a barrier island, which barrier island meets (1)35 all of the following conditions: 36 It has permanent inhabitation of residents residing in an a. 37 unincorporated area. 38 It is bounded on the east by the Atlantic Ocean and on the west by a b. 39 coastal sound. 40 It contains either a National Wildlife Refuge or a portion of a National c. 41 Seashore. 42 d. It has no bridge access to the mainland of the county and is only 43 accessible by marine vessel. 44 Up to two sites in a county that is bounded by the largest sound on the East (2)45 Coast and the county seat is located at the intersection of two rivers, which 46 divide the county." 47 **SECTION 8.** This act is effective when it becomes law.
