A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2 AN ACT AMENDING THE STATE RECOGNITION OF THE LUMBEE TRIBE OF NORTH 3 CAROLINA.

4 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 5

SECTION 1. G.S 71A-3 reads as rewritten:

6 "§ 71A-3. Lumbee Tribe of North Carolina; rights, privileges, immunities, obligations and 7 duties.

8 The Indians now residing in Robeson and adjoining counties of North Carolina, originally found by the first white settlers on the Lumbee River in Robeson County, and claiming joint 9 10 descent from remnants of early American Colonists and certain tribes of Indians originally inhabiting the coastal regions of North Carolina, who have previously been known as "Croatan 11 Indians," "Indians of Robeson County," and "Cherokee Indians of Robeson County," shall, from 12 and after April 20, 1953, be designated and officially recognized as Lumbee Tribe of North 13 Carolina and shall continue to enjoy all rights, privileges and immunities enjoyed by them as 14 citizens of the State as now provided by law, and shall continue to be subject to all the obligations 15 and duties of citizens under the law.as an American Indian Tribe with a recognized tribal 16 governing body carrying out and exercising substantial governmental duties and powers similar 17 to the State, being recognized as eligible for the special programs and services provided by the 18 19 United Sates to Indians because of their status as Indians."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law. 20
