March 19, 2019 1 A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 2 AN ACT TO ALLOW A DISTILLERY TO SELL MALT BEVERAGES AND UNFORTIFIED 3 AND FORTIFIED WINE; TO ALLOW CERTAIN ORDERS OF ELIGIBLE DISTILLERY 4 PRODUCTS; TO REVISE THE LAW GOVERNING THE SALE OF SPIRITUOUS 5 LIQUOR BY A DISTILLERY TO VISITORS FOR CONSUMPTION OFF THE 6 PREMISES; TO ALLOW A DISTILLERY TO ISSUE PURCHASE-TRANSPORTATION 7 PERMITS FOR SPIRITUOUS LIQUOR SOLD BY THE DISTILLERY; AND TO ALLOW 8 SPIRITUOUS LIQUOR TASTINGS AT AN ABC STORE. 9 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts: 10 11 PART I. ALLOW DISTILLERIES TO SELL MALT BEVERAGES AND UNFORTIFIED 12 **AND FORTIFIED WINE** 13 **SECTION 1.(a)** G.S. 18B-1001 reads as rewritten: 14 "§ 18B-1001. Kinds of ABC permits; places eligible. When the issuance of the permit is lawful in the jurisdiction in which the premises are located, 15 the Commission may issue the following kinds of permits: 16 17 On-Premises Malt Beverage Permit. - An on-premises malt beverage permit (1)authorizes (i) the retail sale of malt beverages for consumption on the 18 premises, (ii) the retail sale of malt beverages in the manufacturer's original 19 container for consumption off the premises, and (iii) the retail sale of malt 20 beverages in a cleaned and sanitized container that is filled or refilled and 21 sealed for consumption off the premises and that identifies the permittee and 22 23 the date the container was filled or refilled. It also authorizes the holder of the permit to ship malt beverages in closed containers to individual purchasers 24 25 inside and outside the State. The permit may be issued for any of the 26 following: 27 . . . 28 The holder of a distillery permit authorized under G.S. 18B-1105. k. 29 30 On-Premises Unfortified Wine Permit. - An on-premises unfortified wine (3) permit authorizes (i) the retail sale of unfortified wine for consumption on the 31 32 premises, either alone or mixed with other beverages, (ii) the retail sale of 33 unfortified wine in the manufacturer's original container for consumption off the premises, and (iii) the retail sale of unfortified wine dispensed from a tap 34 connected to a pressurized container utilizing carbon dioxide or similar gas 35



into a cleaned and sanitized container that is filled or refilled and sealed for

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consumption off the premises and that identifies the permittee and the date the container was filled or refilled. The permit also authorizes the permittee to transfer unfortified wine, not more than four times per calendar year, to another on-premises unfortified wine permittee that is under common ownership or control as the transferor. Except as authorized by this subdivision, transfers of wine by on-premises unfortified wine permittees, purchases of wine by a retail permittee from another retail permittee for the purpose of resale, and sale of wine by a retail permittee to another retail permittee for the purpose of resale are unlawful. In addition, a particular brand of wine may be transferred only if both the transferor and transferee are located within the territory designated between the winery and the wholesaler on file with the Commission. Prior to or contemporaneous with any such transfer, the transferor shall notify each wholesaler who distributes the transferred product of the transfer. The notice shall be in writing or verifiable electronic format and shall identify the transferor and transferee, the date of the transfer, quantity, and items transferred. The holder of the permit is authorized to ship unfortified wine in closed containers to individual purchasers inside and outside the State. Orders received by a winery by telephone, Internet, mail, facsimile, or other off-premises means of communication shall be shipped pursuant to a wine shipper permit and not pursuant to this subdivision. The permit may be issued for any of the following: . . .

(5)On-Premises Fortified Wine Permit. - An on-premises fortified wine permit authorizes the retail sale of fortified wine for consumption on the premises, either alone or mixed with other beverages, and the retail sale of fortified wine in the manufacturer's original container for consumption off the premises. The permit also authorizes the permittee to transfer fortified wine, not more than four times per calendar year, to another on-premises fortified wine permittee that is under common ownership or control as the transferor. Except as authorized by this subdivision, transfers of wine by on-premises fortified wine permittees, purchases of wine by a retail permittee from another retail permittee for the purpose of resale, and sale of wine by a retail permittee to another retail permittee for the purpose of resale are unlawful. In addition, a particular brand of wine may be transferred only if both the transferor and transferee are located within the territory designated between the winery and the wholesaler on file with the Commission. Prior to or contemporaneous with any such transfer, the transferor shall notify each wholesaler who distributes the transferred product of the transfer. The notice shall be in writing or verifiable electronic format and shall identify the transferor and transferee, the date of the transfer, quantity, and items transferred. The holder of the permit is authorized to ship fortified wine in closed containers to individual purchasers inside and outside the State. Orders received by a winery by telephone, Internet, mail, facsimile, or other off-premises means of communication shall be shipped pursuant to a wine shipper permit and not pursuant to this subdivision. 27	ABC stores where the local ABC board has approved the tasting, trade shows, conventions,
28	hopping malls, street festivals, holiday festivals, agricultural festivals, balloon races, local
29	und-raisers, and other similar events approved by the Commission."

36	and consumed by each consumer shall not exceed 1.0 ounce of spirituous
37	liquor in any calendar day.

39	(7) A venue allowing tastings shall designate a tasting area within the venue that
40	enables the permit holder to ensure that the consumer tasting is being
41	conducted in compliance with this section. Consumers shall only be allowed
42	to consume tasting samples within the designated tasting area.
43	
44	(11) For tastings conducted in an ABC store, the Commission shall adopt rules to
45	ensure that holders of distillery permits issued under G.S. 18B-1105 are
46	provided by local ABC boards reasonable opportunities to conduct tastings."
47	<b>SECTION 6.(c)</b> G.S. $18B-301(f)(1)$ reads as rewritten:
48	"(1) Any person to consume fortified wine, spirituous liquor, or mixed beverages
49	or to offer such beverages to another person at any of the following places:
50	a. On <u>Unless a consumer tasting authorized by G.S. 18B-1114.7 is being</u>
51	conducted, on the premises of an ABC store.

1	b. Upon any property used or occupied by a local board.
2	c. On any public road, street, highway, or sidewalk, unless a consumer
3	tasting authorized by G.S. 18B-1114.7 is being conducted."

5	PART VII. RULES
6	SECTION 7. The Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission shall amend its rules
7	consistent with the provisions of this act. The Commission may use the procedure set forth in
8	G.S. 150B-21.1 to amend any rules as required under this section.
9	
10	PART VIII. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE
11	SECTION 8. If any provision of this act or its application is held invalid, the
12	invalidity does not affect other provisions or applications of this act that can be given effect
13	without the invalid provisions or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
14	severable.
15	
16	PART IX. EFFECTIVE DATE
17	<b>SECTION 9.</b> Except as otherwise provided, this act becomes effective July 1, 2019.
