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PART II. OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP GRANT PROGRAM

SECTION 2.1. G.S. 115C-562.1(3) reads as rewritten:

- "(3) Eligible students. A student residing in North Carolina who has not yet received a high school diploma and who meets all of the following requirements:
 - a. Meets one of the following criteria:
 - 1. Was a full-time student (i) assigned to and attending a public school pursuant to G.S. 115C-366 or (ii) enrolled in a Department of Defense Elementary and Secondary School, established pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 2164 and located in North Carolina, during the spring semester prior to the school year for which the student is applying.
 - 2. Received a scholarship grant for the school year prior to the school year for which the student is applying.
 - 3. Is entering either kindergarten or the first grade.grade, including children who do not meet the age-related eligibility requirements for entry into kindergarten set forth in G.S. 115C-364, but are at least four years of age and deemed by a nonpublic school to have the maturity to justify admission to the school.
 - 4. Is a child in foster care as defined in G.S. 131D-10.2(9).
 - 5. Is a child whose adoption decree was entered not more than one year prior to submission of the scholarship grant application.
 - 6. Is a child whose parent or legal guardian is on full-time duty status in the active uniformed service of the United States, including members of the National Guard and Reserve on active duty orders pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 12301, et seq., and 10 U.S.C. § 12401, et seq.
 - a1. Has not enrolled in a postsecondary institution in a matriculated status eligible for enrollment for 12 hours of academic credit.
 - b. Resides in a household with an income level not in excess of one hundred thirty three percent (133%)one hundred fifty percent (150%) of the amount required for the student to qualify for the federal free or reduced-price lunch program. The Authority shall not count any distribution from the estate of a decedent in calculating the income level of the applicant's household for the purposes of determining eligibility for a scholarship under this sub-subdivision."

SECTION 2.2. G.S. 115C-562.2(a) reads as rewritten:

- "(a) The Authority shall make available no later than February 1 annually applications to eligible students for the award of scholarship grants to attend any nonpublic school. Information about scholarship grants and the application process shall be made available on the Authority's Web site. Beginning March 15, the Authority shall begin awarding scholarship grants according to the following criteria:
 - (1) First priority shall be given to eligible students who received a scholarship grant for the school year prior to the school year for which the students are applying if those students have applied by March 1.
 - (2) After scholarship grants have been awarded to prior recipients as provided in subdivision (1) of this subsection, scholarships shall be awarded with remaining funds as follows:

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- award scholarship grants to eligible students residing in households with an income level not in excess of the amount required for the student to qualify for the federal free or reduced-price lunch program. No more than forty percent (40%) of the remaining funds shall be used to award scholarship grants to eligible students entering either
- Any remaining funds shall be used to award scholarship grants to all

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PART III. PERSONAL EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNTS

SECTION 3. G.S. 115C-591(3) reads as rewritten:

- "(3)Eligible student. – A student residing in North Carolina who has not yet received a high school diploma and who meets all of the following requirements:
 - Is eligible to attend a North Carolina public school pursuant to a. G.S. 115C-366.G.S. 115C-366, including children who do not meet the age-related eligibility requirements for entry into kindergarten set forth in G.S. 115C-364, but are at least four years of age and deemed by a nonpublic school to have the maturity to justify admission to the school.
 - b. Has not enrolled in a postsecondary institution in a matriculated status eligible for enrollment for 12 hours of academic credit.
 - c. Is a child with a disability, as defined in G.S. 115C-106.3(1), including, for example, intellectual disability, hearing impairment, speech or language impairment, visual impairment, serious emotional disturbance, orthopedic impairment, autism, traumatic brain injury, other health impairments, specific learning disability, or disability as may be required to be included under IDEA.
 - d. Has not been placed in a nonpublic school or facility by a public agency at public expense."

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PART IV. EFFECTIVE DATE

SECTION 4. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the award of scholarship funds for the 2020-2021 school year.

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
