8	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:			
9	SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of S.L. 2017-57, or of the Committee			
10	Report described in Section 39.2 of that act to the contrary, the sum of two hundred fifty thousand			
11	dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2017-2018 fiscal year appropriated in that act to			
12	the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs for the construction of public facilities at the			
13	North Carolina Veterans Memorial Pavilion in Broadway, North Carolina, shall not revert on			
14	June 30, 2019, as required by Section 6.13(c) of that act, but shall remain available for			
15	expenditure until June 30, 2020.
