A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 2 AN ACT PROVIDING THAT FUNDS APPROPRIATED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF 3 PUBLIC FACILITIES AT THE NORTH CAROLINA VETERANS MEMORIAL 4 PAVILION SHALL NOT REVERT TO THE GENERAL FUND UNTIL JUNE 30, 2020, 5 PROVIDING THAT CERTAIN REGIONAL WATER AND SEWER FUNDING SHALL 6 NOT REVERT UNTIL JUNE 30, 2021, AND REDIRECTING CERTAIN STORM 7 **RESILIENCE FUNDS.**

8 The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

9 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any provision of S.L. 2017-57, or of the Committee 10 Report described in Section 39.2 of that act to the contrary, the sum of two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000) in nonrecurring funds for the 2017-2018 fiscal year appropriated in that act to 11 the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs for the construction of public facilities at the 12 North Carolina Veterans Memorial Pavilion in Broadway, North Carolina, shall not revert on 13 June 30, 2019, as required by Section 6.13(c) of that act, but shall remain available for 14 15 expenditure until June 30, 2020.

16 SECTION 2. Section 14.20A of S.L. 2016-94, as amended by Section 1 of S.L. 17 2017-17, reads as rewritten:

18 **"REGIONAL WATER AND SEWER FUNDING**

19 "SECTION 14.20A.(a) Of the funds appropriated to the Department of Environmental 20 Quality, Division of Water Infrastructure, by this act, the sum of fourteen million five hundred 21 forty-eight thousand nine hundred eighty-one dollars (\$14,548,981) shall be used to fund 22 interconnection, extension of water and sewer lines, and related water and wastewater system 23 modification and expansion involving the Counties of Rockingham and Guilford and the 24 municipalities of Oak Ridge, Stokesdale, Summerfield, Reidsville, Madison, and Mayodan. Of 25 the funds allocated by this section, no more than twenty-five percent (25%) of the funds shall be used for Guilford County and may include one or more of the municipalities listed in this section 26 located in Guilford County, and no more than seventy-five percent (75%) shall be used for 27 28 Rockingham County and may include one or more of the municipalities listed in this section 29 located in Rockingham County. The funds allocated by this section may be spent for planning, 30 design, survey, real property acquisition, construction, repair, and any other activities necessary 31 to improve the performance and reliability and expand the capacity and service footprint of 32 participating water and wastewater systems in Rockingham and Guilford Counties. The Counties of Rockingham and Guilford and the municipalities participating in the interconnection and 33 extension of water and sewer lines within each county funded by this section shall agree on the 34 35 use of the funds allocated by this section through any combination of (i) interlocal agreements



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1 under Article 20 of Chapter 160A of the General Statutes that specify, at a minimum, the 2 ownership of the water lines, sewer lines, and related infrastructure funded by this section 3 and long-term maintenance, repair, and replacement responsibility or (ii) one or more regional 4 water and sewer authorities under Article 1 of Chapter 162A of the General Statutes. 5 "SECTION 14.20A.(b) Notwithstanding G.S. 143C-6-23(f1)(1) and G.S. 143C-1-2, funds 6 allocated by this section shall be held in reserve by the Office of State Budget and Management 7 and the allocations to each County shall be released when the County and one or more of the 8 municipalities specified in subsection (a) of this section reach agreement on the funds allocated 9 to that County by this section through interlocal agreements or the formation of regional water 10 and sewer authorities or a combination of interlocal agreements and regional water and sewer 11 authorities. Funds not spent or encumbered by June 30, 2020, 2021, shall be returned by the local governments or regional water and sewer authority to the Office of State Budget and 12 13 Management and revert to the General Fund." 14 SECTION 3. Section 13.9 of S.L. 2018-5, as amended by Section 2.9 of S.L. 15 2018-138, reads as rewritten: 16 "DEQ GRANT-IN-AIDGRANTS-IN-AID 17 "SECTION 13.9.(a) Of the funds appropriated in this act to the Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Water Resources, the sum of five million dollars 18 19 (\$5,000,000) shall be used following sums are allocated to the indicated recipients for the 20 indicated storm resiliency purposes: 21 Three million four hundred thousand dollars (\$3,400,000) to provide a (1)22 grant-in-aid to Resource Institute, Inc., for the purpose of working with local 23 governments on Topsail Island and engineering firms to develop, plan, or 24 implement projects in or benefitting the Towns of Surf City and Topsail Beach 25 intended to mitigate the impacts of future hurricanes on Topsail Island.those 26 local governments and their adjoining coastlines. 27 One million six hundred thousand dollars (\$1,600,000) to the Town of North (2)Topsail Beach for hurricane recovery projects in or benefitting the Town and 28 29 its adjoining coastline. 30 "SECTION 13.9.(b) On or before October 1, 2019, Resource Institute, Inc., the recipients 31 of allocations under this section shall submit a report to the Joint Legislative Oversight 32 Committee on Agriculture and Natural and Economic Resources and the Fiscal Research 33 Division. The report shall contain at least all of the following: 34 A list of participating local governments and engineering firms and other (1)35 partners in projects funded under this section. 36 A list of projects funded on Topsail Island, including a summary of the costs (2)37 and the scope of the project. 38 A summary of the emerging techniques developed and implemented as a result (3) 39 of the efforts of the collaboration between local governments, engineering 40 firms, and Resource Institute, Inc. 41 Documentation of the impact on the resilience of beach nourishment projects (4) 42 and the number of beach nourishment projects assisted." 43 **SECTION 4.** This act becomes effective June 30, 2019.
