1 A JOINT RESOLUTION ADJOURNING THE SESSION RECONVENED PURSUANT TO
2 RESOLUTION 2024-2 AND AMENDING RESOLUTION 2024-2, AS AMENDED BY
3 RESOLUTION 2024-5.

4 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives, the Senate concurring:

5 **SECTION 1.** When the Senate and the House of Representatives jointly adjourn on
6 the date this resolution is ratified, they stand adjourned to reconvene as provided in Resolution
7 2024-2, as amended by Resolution 2024-5 and this resolution.

8 **SECTION 2.** Resolution 2024-2, as amended by Resolution 2024-5, reads as
9 rewritten:

11 "**SECTION 4.(a)** When the House of Representatives and the Senate adjourn on ~~Friday,~~
12 ~~November 22,~~ Wednesday, November 20, 2024, they stand adjourned to reconvene on
13 ~~Wednesday, December 11,~~ Monday, December 2, 2024, at 12:00 noon.

14 "**SECTION 4.(b)** During the regular session that reconvenes on ~~Wednesday, December 11,~~
15 ~~Monday, December 2, 2024~~, only the following matters may be considered:

- 16 (1) Bills returned by the Governor with his objections under Section 22 of Article
17 II of the North Carolina Constitution, but solely for the purpose of considering
18 overriding of the veto upon reconsideration of the bill.
- 19 (2) Bills providing for the selection, appointment, or confirmation as required by
20 law, including the filling of vacancies of positions for which the appointees
21 were elected by the General Assembly upon recommendation of the Speaker
22 of the House of Representatives, President of the Senate, President Pro
23 Tempore of the Senate, or a minority leader of a chamber of the General
24 Assembly.
- 25 (3) Bills providing for action on gubernatorial nominations or appointments.
- 26 (4) Bills responding to actions related to litigation challenging the legality of
27 legislative enactments.
- 28 (5) Any bills relating to election laws, including bills concerning the districts for
29 Congressional, State House, State Senate, judicial, municipal, county, and
30 other elected officials, and containing no other matters.
- 31 (6) Bills providing for impeachment pursuant to Article IV of the North Carolina
32 Constitution or Chapter 123 of the General Statutes.

33 (6a) Bills:

- 34 a. Proposing an amendment or amendments to the North Carolina
35 Constitution and containing no other matter.



- 1 b. Proposing an amendment or amendments to the North Carolina
- 2 Constitution and containing no other matter other than statutory
- 3 conforming changes to implement such bills.
- 4 c. Solely making statutory and transitional changes to implement bills
- 5 under sub-subdivision a. of this subdivision.
- 6 (7) Simple resolutions addressing organizational matters of each respective
- 7 house.
- 8 (8) Adoption of conference reports.
- 9 (9) ~~A-Joint resolutions, including joint resolution-resolutions~~ further adjourning
- 10 the 2023 Regular Session, amending a joint resolution adjourning the 2023
- 11 Regular Session, or adjourning the 2023 Regular Session, sine die.
- 12 "SECTION 5. When the House of Representatives and the Senate, constituting the 2023
- 13 Regular Session of the General Assembly, adjourn on Friday, December 13, 2024, they stand
- 14 adjourned sine die.
