Definitions. The following definitions apply in this Article: 10 11 Fiscal year. – Any accounting period consisting of 12 consecutive months. (a) 12 Fiscal year spending. – The total amount of monies appropriated by the State, (b) 13 not including the following: Appropriations funded by monies received from the federal 14 1. 15 government. 16 <u>2.</u> Principal and interest on bonded indebtedness. Appropriations funded by unemployment and disability insurance 17 <u>3.</u> 18 funds. 19 4. Appropriations funded by discretionary user charges to the extent that the charges do not exceed the cost of the goods or services and their 20 21 purchase by the user is discretionary. 22 Appropriations funded from permanent endowments, trust funds, or <u>5.</u> 23 pension funds. 24 Proceeds of gifts or bequests made for purposes specified by the donor. 6. 25 Monies appropriated for tax relief. Inflation. – The percentage change in the Consumer Price Index for the United 26 (c) States for each calendar year as published by the Federal Bureau of Labor 27 28 Statistics. 29 Population. – The number of people residing in the State, excluding Armed (d) Forces stationed overseas, as determined by the United States Census Bureau 30 31 based on decennial census figures or as estimated annually by the United 32 States Census Bureau. 33 "Sec. 2. Spending limits. 34 Fiscal year spending limit. – The maximum annual percentage change in State fiscal



year spending equals inflation plus the percentage change in State population in the prior calendar

Modification by super majority vote. – The General Assembly may vote to increase (2) the fiscal year spending limit established under this Section. An increase in the fiscal year spending limit must be approved by a two-thirds majority of the members of each house of the General Assembly."

SECTION 2. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the State at the general election in 2024, which election shall be conducted under the laws then governing elections in the State. Ballots, voting systems, or both may be used in accordance with Chapter 163 of the General Statutes. The question to be used in the voting systems and ballots shall be:

Constitutional amendment limiting the annual growth of the State budget to a percentage equal to the sum of annual inflation and the State's annual population growth rate unless increased in a year in which two-thirds of both chambers of the General Assembly votes in favor of the increase."

SECTION 3. If a majority of votes cast on the question are in favor of the amendment set out in Section 1 of this act, the State Board of Elections shall certify the amendment to the Secretary of State. The Secretary of State shall enroll the amendment so certified among the permanent records of that office. The amendment set out in Section 1 of this act becomes effective upon certification and applies to fiscal years beginning on or after that date.
