classify, accession, preserve, and where feasible exhibit such materials and make them available		
for study. Within available funds, one or more branch museums of history or specialized regional history museums may be established and administered by the Department. The Department of		
history museums may be established and administered by the Department. The Department of		
Natural and Cultural Resources, subject to the availability of staff and funds, may give financial,		
technical, and professional assistance to nonstate historical museums sponsored by governmental		
agencies and nonprofit organizations according to regulations adopted by the North Carolina
