	"(f) Access for Youth Groups. – Charter schools are encouraged to facilitate access for		
	students to participate in activities provided by any youth group listed in Title 36 of the United		
	States Code as a patriotic society, such as the Boy Scouts of America, and its affiliated North		
Carolina groups and councils, and the Girl Scouts of the United States of America, and its			
affiliated North Carolina groups and councils. Student participation in any activities offered by			
these organizations shall not interfere with instructional time during the school day for the			
	purposes of encouraging civic education. Charter schools shall develop policies to ensure that		
	youth groups have access to schools in accordance with the provisions of G.S. 115C-206(4)."		
	SECTION 4. G.S. 115C-238.66(13) reads as rewritten:		
	"(13) Access for youth groups Regional schools are encouraged to facilitate		
	access for students to participate in activities provided by any youth group		
	listed in Title 36 of the United States Code as a patriotic society, such as the		
	Boy Scouts of America, and its affiliated North Carolina groups and councils,		
	and the Girl Scouts of the United States of America, and its affiliated North		
	Carolina groups and councils. Student participation in any activities offered		
	by these organizations shall not interfere with instructional time during the		
	school day for the purposes of encouraging civic education. Regional schools		
	shall develop policies to ensure that youth groups have access to schools in		
	accordance with the provisions of G.S. 115C-206(4)."		
	SECTION 5. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with		
	the 2023-2024 school year.
