The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:		
	ECTION 1. Chapter III of the Charter of the City of Northwest, being Chap	oter 222
of the 1993 Session Laws, reads as written:		
	"CHAPTER III.	
"GOVERNING BODY.		
"Sec. 3.1. Structure of Governing Body; Number of Members. The governing body of the		
City of Northwest is the City Council, which has five members, and the Mayor.		
"Sec. 3.2. Manner of Electing Council. The Council members shall reside in the respective		
districts they represent as provided in Article IV of this Charter, but all of the qualified voters of		
the entire City elect the members of the Council. To be eligible for election, a person must reside		
in the City.		
"Sec. 3.3. Term of Office of Council Members. Members of the Council are elected to		
four-year terms except that of those elected at the initial election in 1993, the three highest vote		
getters who are elected shall serve for four-year terms and the next two highest vote getters shall		
serve for two-year terms. In <u>1995-2023</u> and quadrennially thereafter, two members of the Council		
shall be elected <u>from District 3</u> for four-year terms. In <u>1997-2025</u> and quadrennially thereafter,		
	rs of the Council shall be elected <u>from Districts 1, 2, and 4</u> for four-year ter	ms.
"		
	ECTION 2. Section 4.1 of the Charter of the City of Northwest, being Chap	oter 222
of the 1993 Session Laws, reads as rewritten:		
"Sec. 4.1. Conduct of Town Elections. The Town officers shall be elected on a nonpartisan		
basis, and the results determined by plurality as provided in G.S. 163-292. Elections shall be		
conducted by the Brunswick County Board of Elections. For the purpose of electing Council		
members, the City is divided into four geographical subdivisions known as districts. Districts 1,		
2, and 4 shall be single-member districts, and District 3 shall be a two-member district. However,		
all qualified voters of the City may cast a vote for each seat. The districts are numbered from one		
to four and are as shown on the existing official map of the City or of the electoral districts, as		

SECTION 3. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies to elections held on or after that date.
