

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

2	AN ACT REDIRECTING FUNDS APPROPRIATED TO THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH		
3	AND HUMAN SERVICES, DIVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, FOR CRISIS		
4	PREGNANCY CENTERS TO INSTEAD BE USED TO SUPPORT THE EXPANSION OF		
5	EVIDENCE-BASED MATERNAL AND INFANT HEALTH PROGRAMS; REQUIRING		
6	THE STATE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT AN AUDIT OF CAROLINA PREGNANCY		
7	CARE FELLOWSHIP; AND ESTABLISHING ADDITIONAL REPORTING		
8	REQUIREMENTS FOR CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTERS THAT RECEIVE STATE		
9	FUNDS.		
10	The General Assembly of North Carolina enacts:

12	PART I. REDIRECT CRISIS PREGNANCY CENTER FUNDS TO EVIDENCE-BASED		
13	MATERNAL AND INFANT HEALTH PROGRAMS		
14	SECTION 1.(a) Section 9H.11 of S.L. 2023-134 is repealed.		
15	<b>SECTION 1.(b)</b> There is appropriated from the General Fund to the Department of		
16	Health and Human Services, Division of Public Health, the sum of six million two hundred fifty		
17	thousand dollars (\$6,250,000) in recurring funds for the 2025-2026 fiscal year and the sum of six		
18	million two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$6,250,000) in recurring funds for the 2026-2027		
19	fiscal year to be used to support the expansion of evidence-based maternal and infant health		
20	programs and services administered by the Department of Health and Human Services.		
21	<b>SECTION 1.(c)</b> This Part becomes effective July 1, 2025.

25	SECTION 2. By March 1, 2026, the State Auditor shall conduct a financial statement		
26	audit of Carolina Pregnancy Care Fellowship, a nonprofit corporation. The State Auditor shall

28	Services and the Fiscal Research Division.
