"§ 115C-78.3. Released time courses.	
<u>(a)</u> <u>T</u>	he following definitions apply in this section:
<u>(1</u>	<u>Released time course. – A course in religious moral instruction taught by a </u>
	sponsoring entity that a student attends during the instructional day.
<u>(2</u>	Sponsoring entity. – An organization that provides released time courses.
<u>(b)</u> R	eleased Time Course Policy The governing body of a public school unit may
adopt a polic	y to allow students to attend a released time course for at least one but no more than
five hours pe	r week. At a minimum, the policy shall require that:
<u>(1</u>	
	attend the released time course.
<u>(2</u>	<u>Transportation to and from the location of the released time course, including</u>
	transportation for students with disabilities, is the complete responsibility of
	the sponsoring entity, parent or legal guardian, or student.
<u>(3</u>	No federal, State, or local funds, other than minimal administrative costs
	incurred by facilitating the released time course policy, are expended in
	providing the released time course.
<u>(</u> 4	Students assume responsibility for any missed schoolwork.
<u>(5</u>	Released time courses are not to be held on school property unless permitted
	under a neutral policy of equal access opening school property for use by
	community groups.
<u>(6</u>	Students shall not be considered absent from school while attending a released
	time course.
<u>(c)</u> <u>C</u>	redit for Released Time Courses Notwithstanding any State Board of Education
rules, as par	t of a governing body of a public school unit's released time course policy, the
governing body may allow the awarding of up to two elective course credits to a student who	
successfully completes a released time course in accordance with the following:	



shall not be denoted as a fail on the student's transcript.

A student's participation in a released time course but failure to earn credit

- taking or seeking to take a released time course from that organization, provide a copy of the syllabus for the course.
- Make provisions for and assume liability for students while they are under (3) supervision of the sponsoring organization."

SECTION 2. This act is effective when it becomes law and applies beginning with the 2025-2026 school year.

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
